1. MINUTES OF DECEMBER 08, 2005 MEETING

Chairperson Anhorn advised a Business Meeting was held in the Closed meeting with elections as follows: Chairperson - W. Anhorn, Vice-Chairperson - D. MacDonald. Mr. W. Stark was reappointed for a 3 term to the Police Commission by City Council on December 19, 2005.

2. INTRODUCTUION OF NEW MEMBERS

Chief Boucher introduced our two new members, Cst. Jason Van Mulligen, 8-year member from Calgary Police Service, and Cst. Kirt Murray, 3-year member with Edmonton Police Service.

3. CHIEF'S REPORT

A) Trends & Statistics (including Bylaw Enforcement)

Inspector Morton provided an overview of the 2005 Year-end Statistics. A noted reduction in robberies, B& E's, motor vehicle thefts, thefts over and under, can be attributed to the increased focus on drug enforcement.

The reduction in motor vehicle collision can be attributed to the increase in education and enforcement by officer contract and photo radar. This has resulted in a reduction in speed and drivers paying more attention. The Police Service goal is to make our streets safe, with traffic moving freely and drivers paying attention to what they are doing.

D/Chief Earl advised warnings will be tracked on our Records Management System. This will allow officers to deal with drivers who have been previously warned about their bad driving habits.

Chief Boucher added a major project in 2005 focused on drug dealers, which resulted in 125 charges.

Inspector Morton provided an overview of the Operational Services Strategies following the 06-08 Business Plan.

4. NEW BUSINESS

B) Thank You to the Media

Chief Boucher thanked the Media for supporting the Medicine Hat Police Service. The community is kept up to date on issues and are aware that the Police Service will try to solve all issues.

C) Integrated Intelligence

D/Chief Earl advised the Integrated Intelligence Unit will be in operation soon, with the transfer of a RCMP member. This unit will support our region in dealing with organized crime and drug problems.

Chairperson Anhorn declared the meeting adjourned at 7:44 PM.

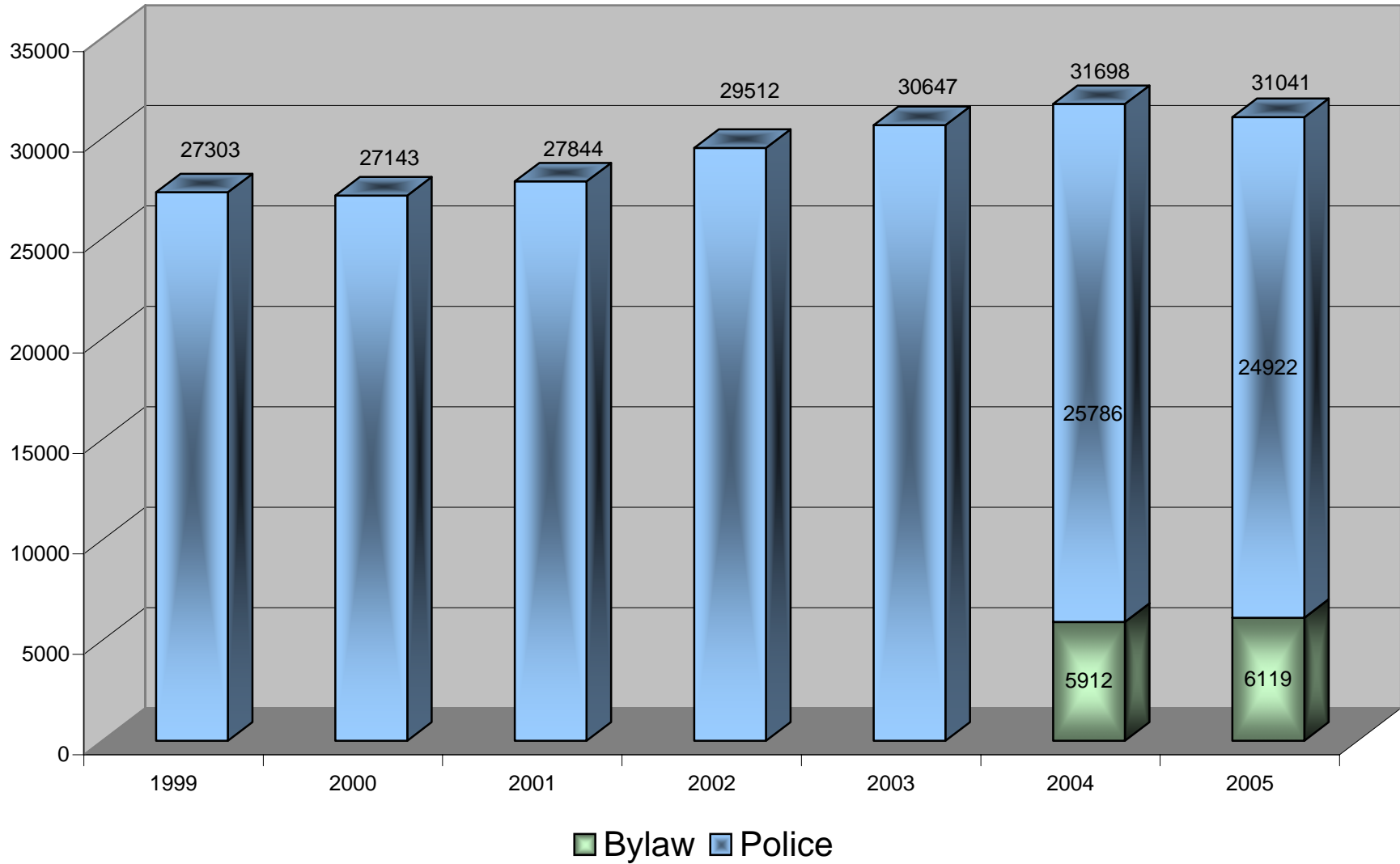

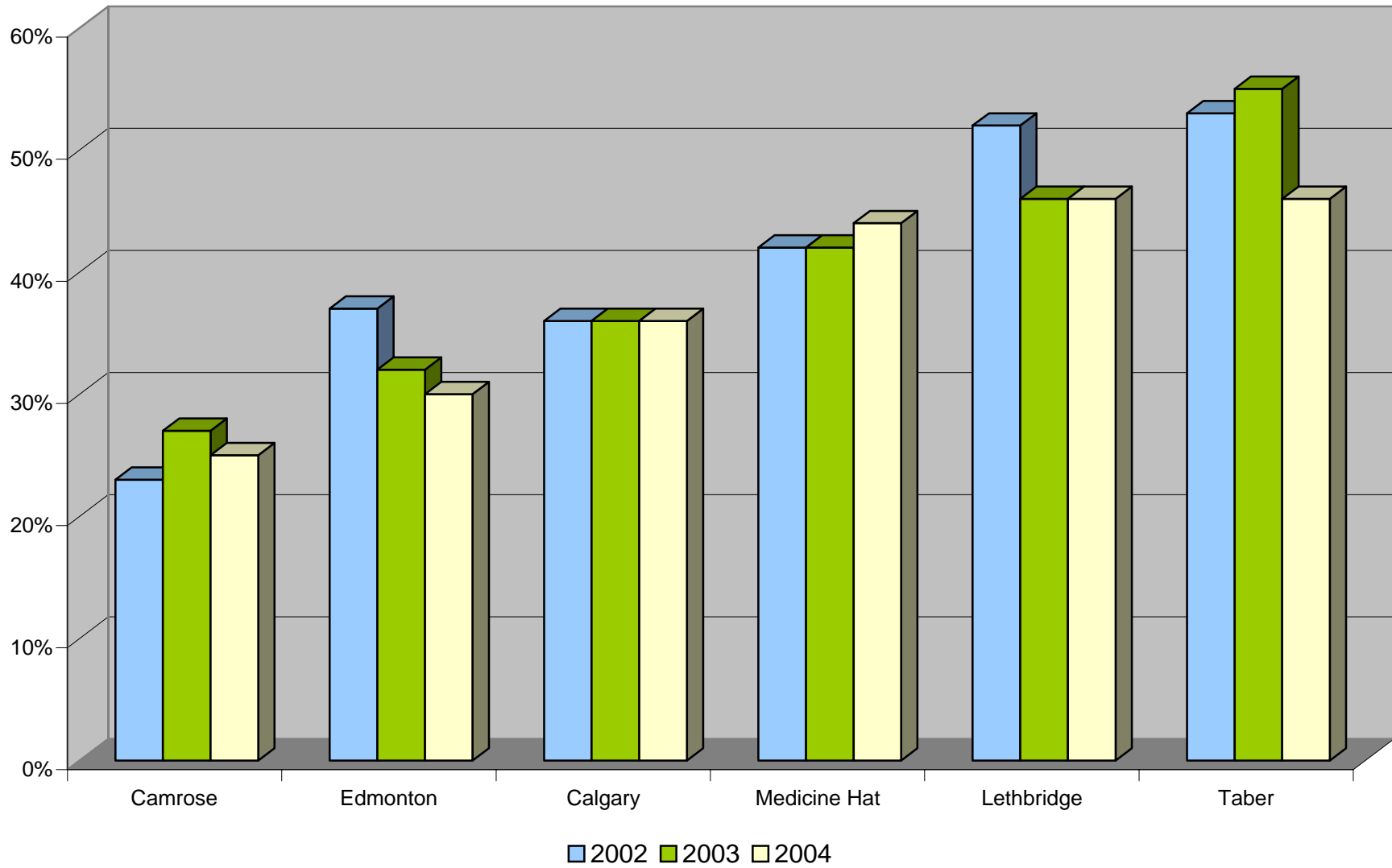

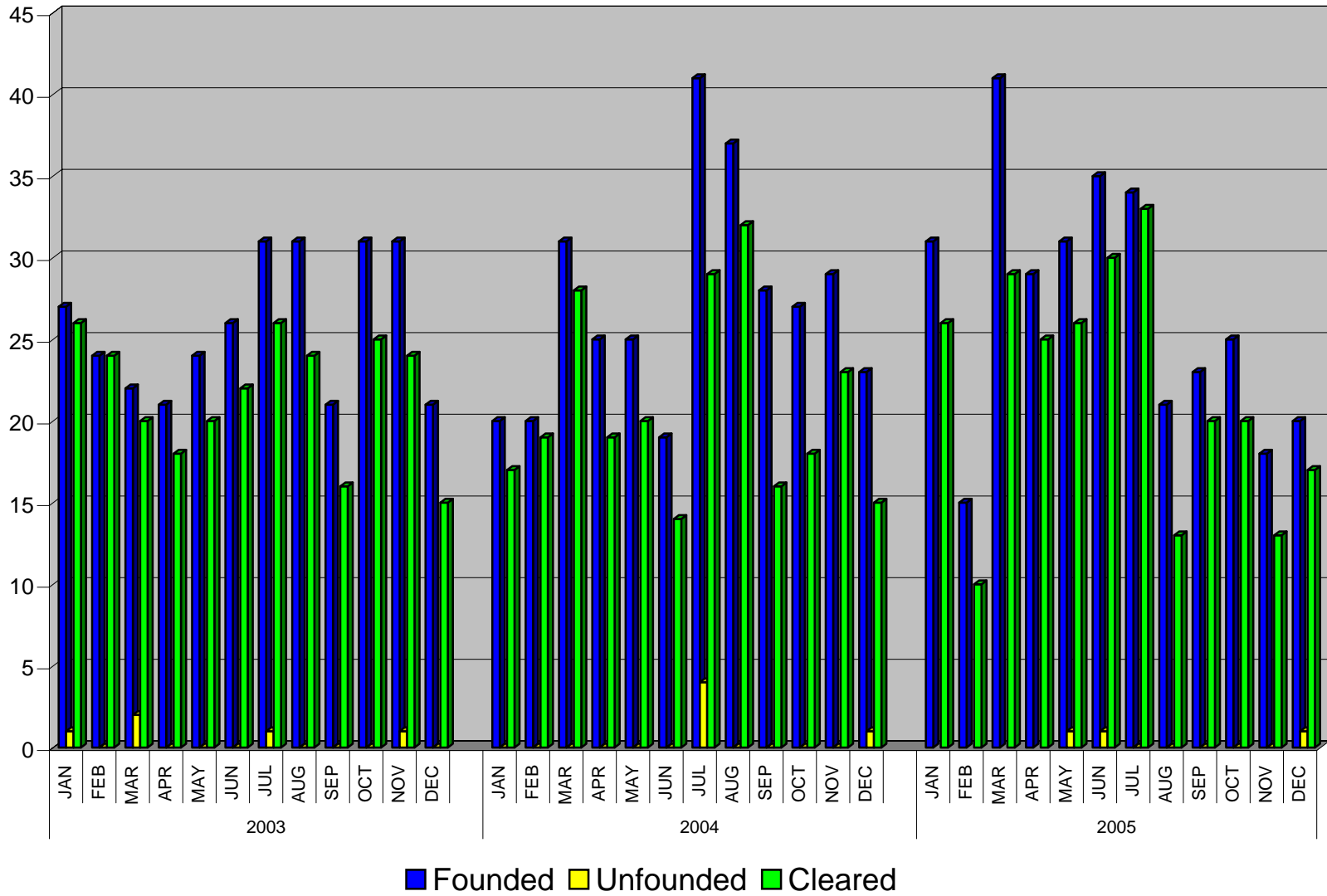


Crime Clearance Rate



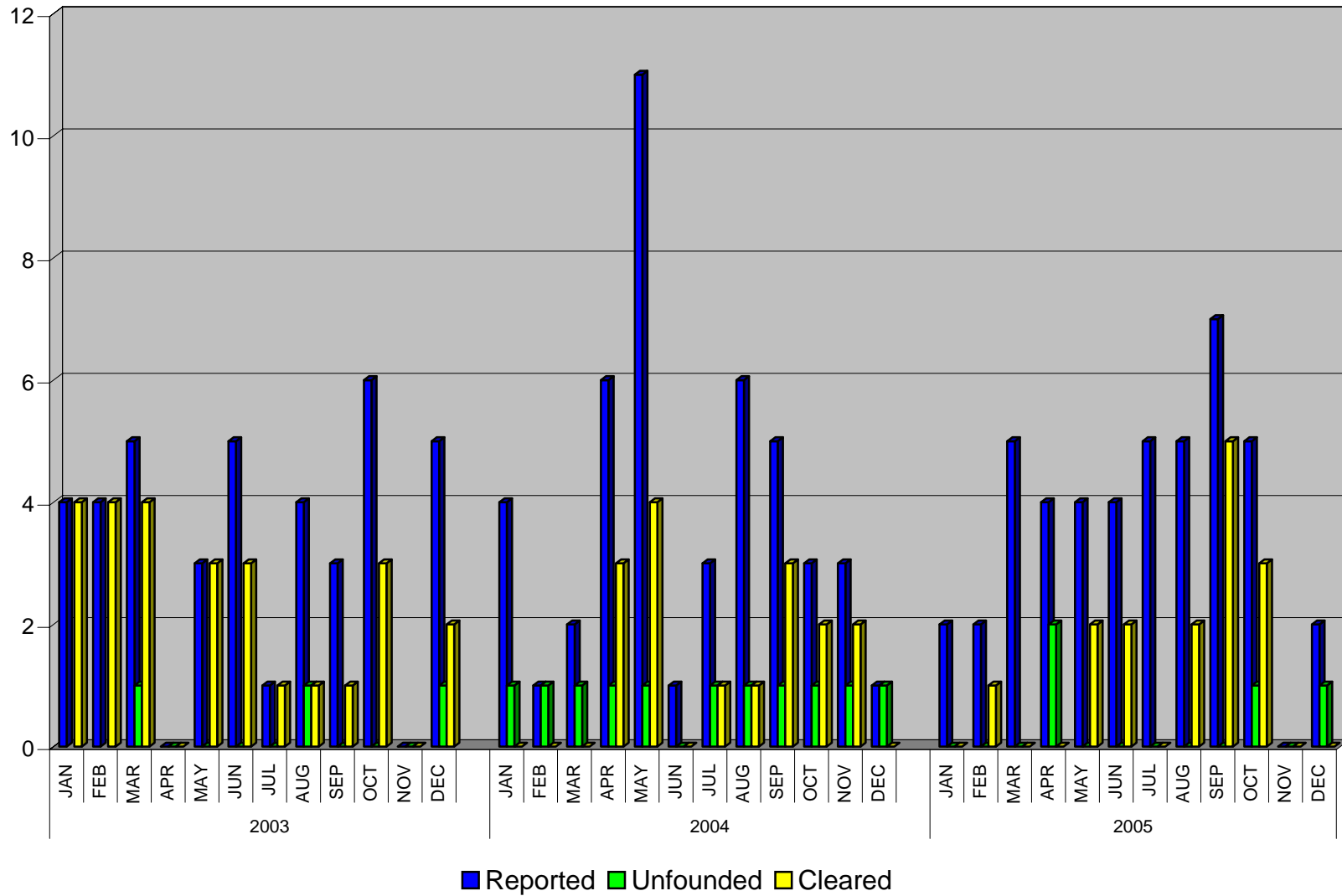

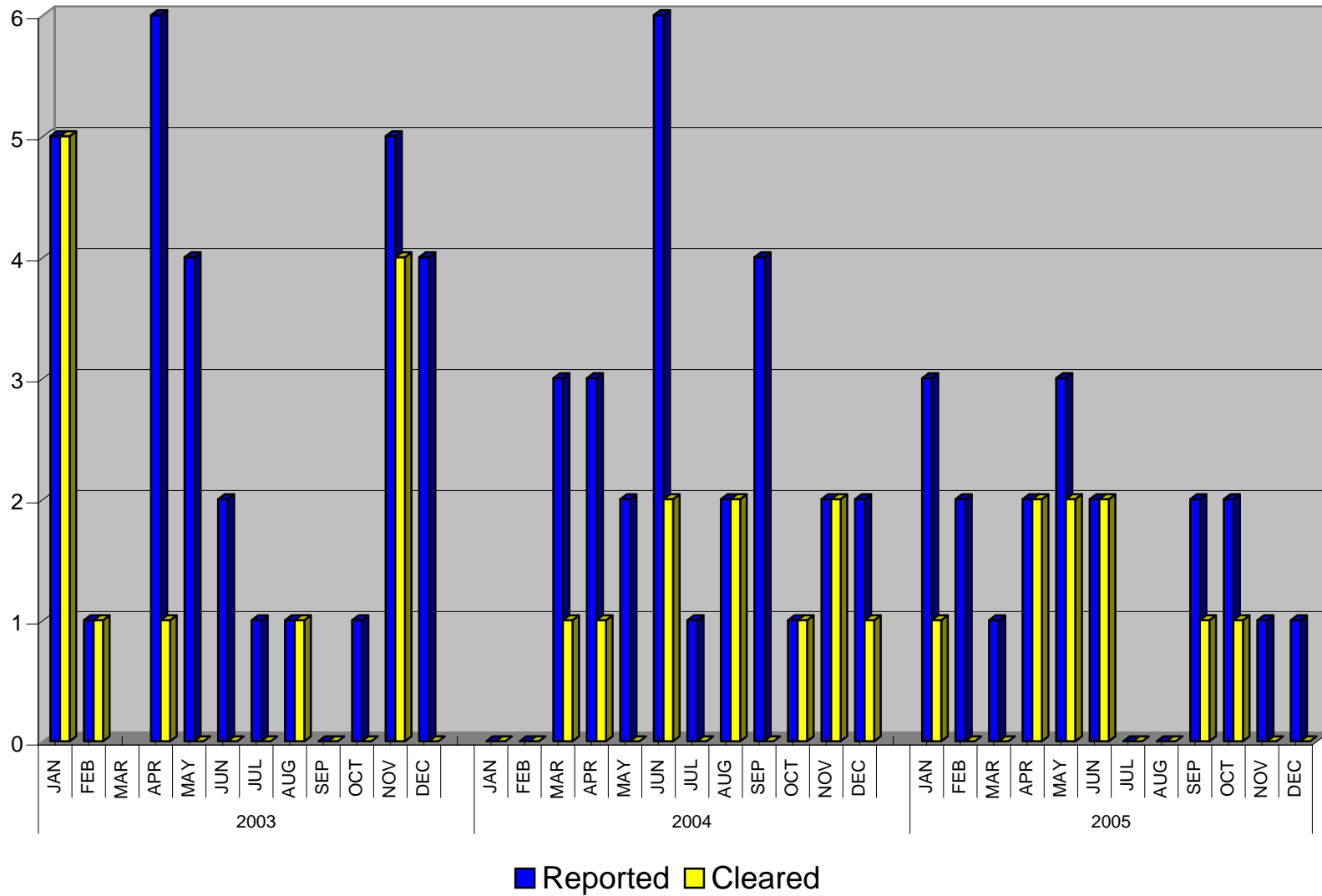
Sexual Assault

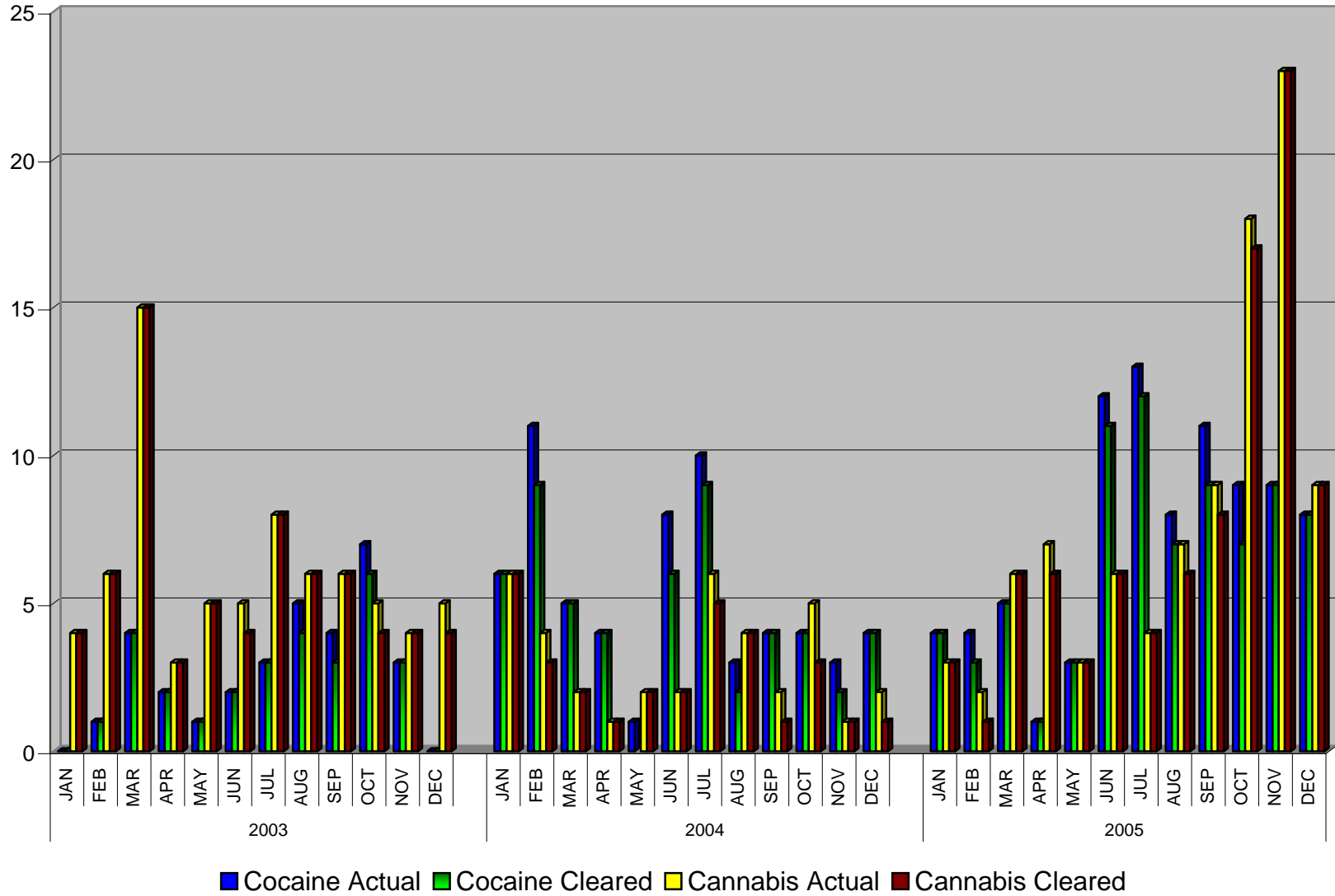
Robbery

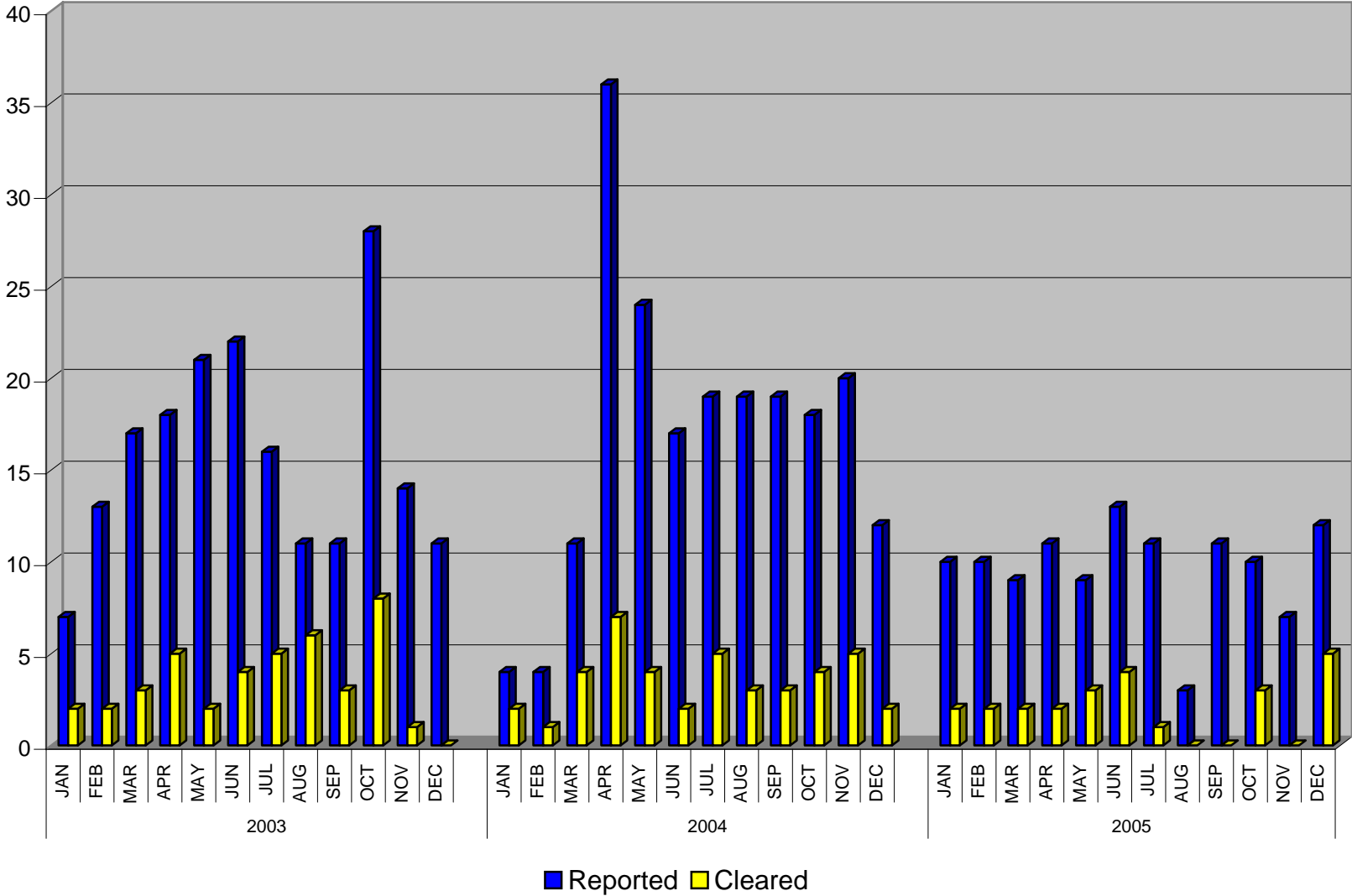
Narcotic Offences

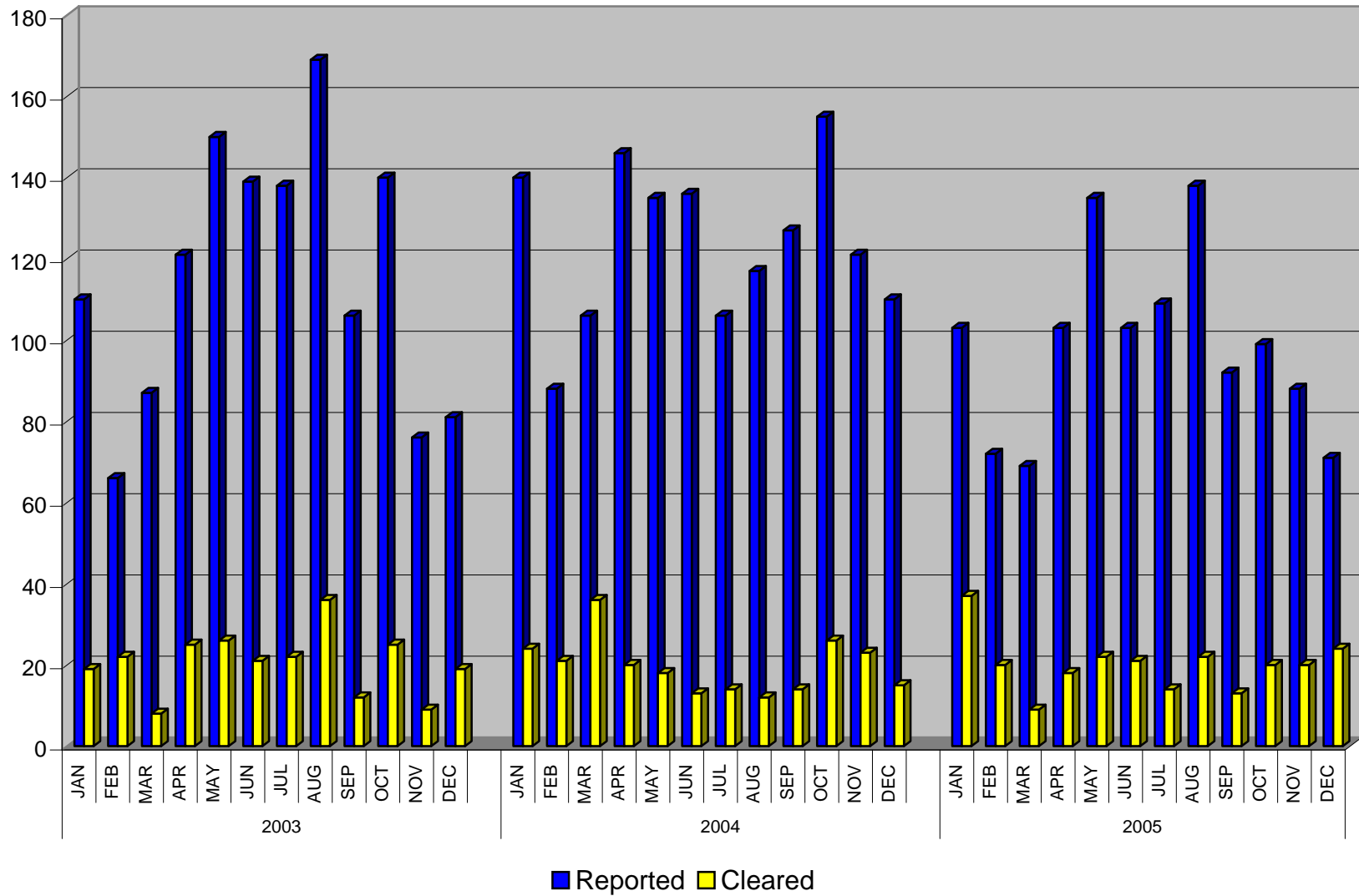
Theft Motor Vehicle

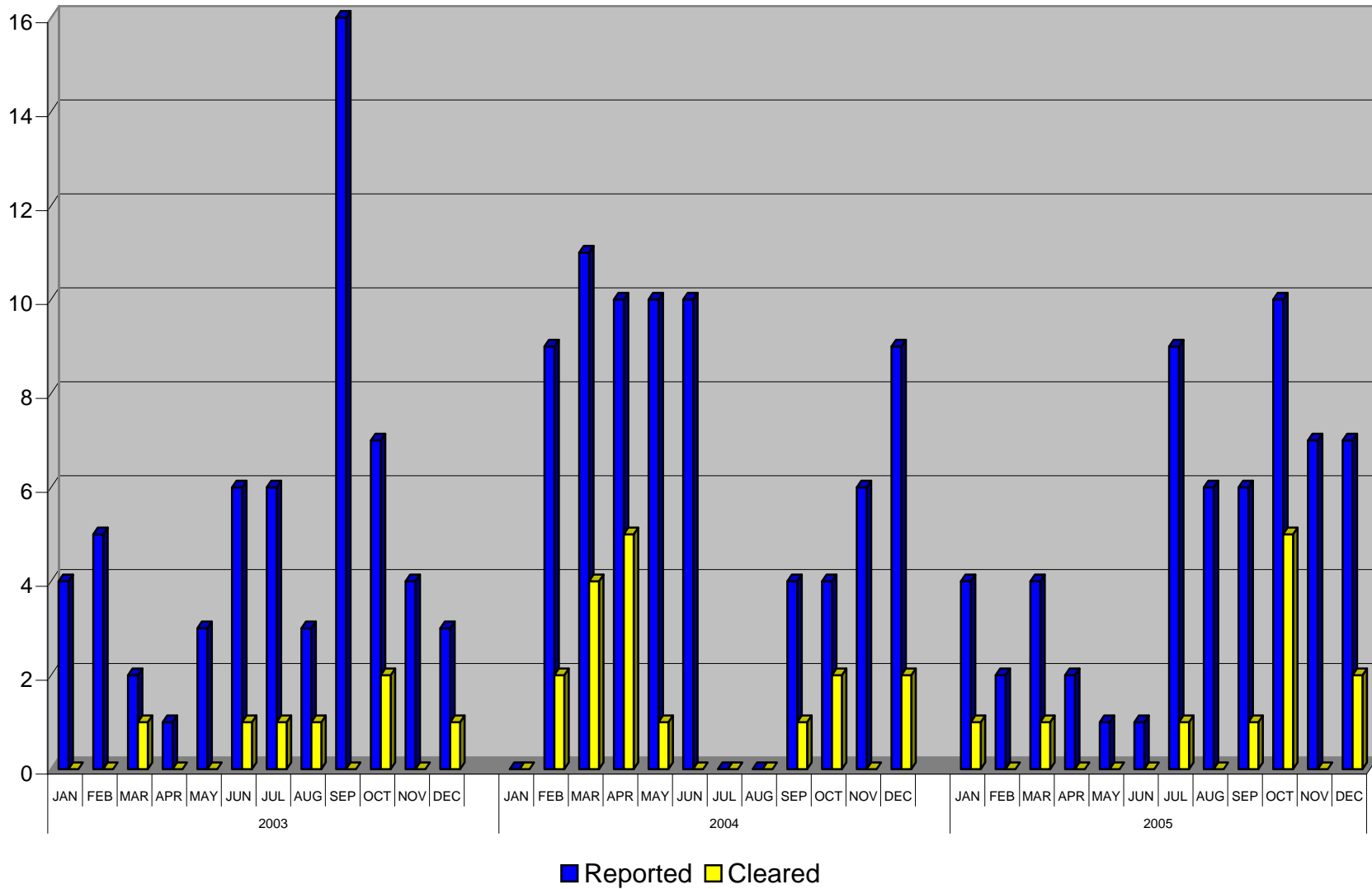
Theft Under

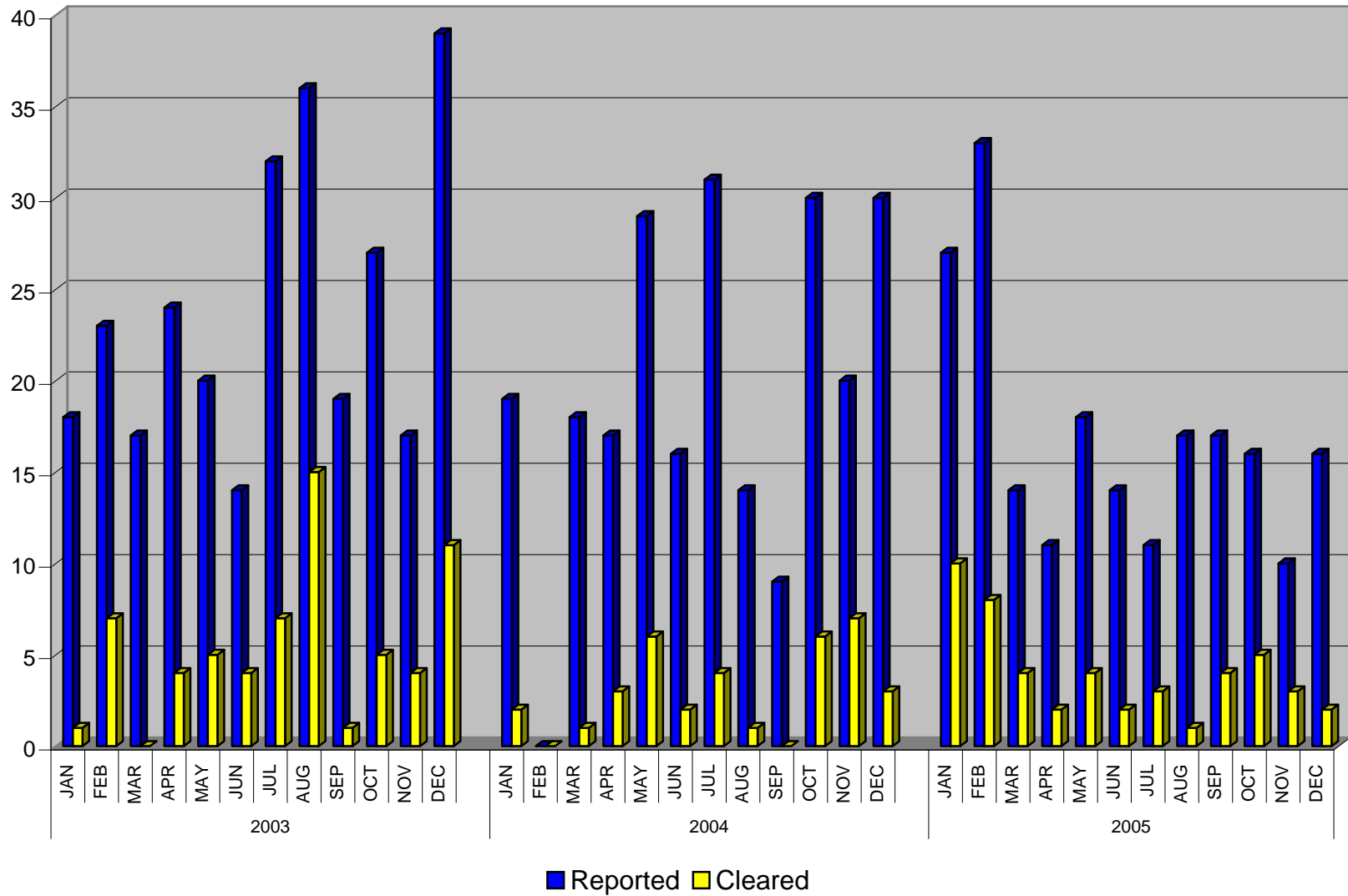
Theft Over

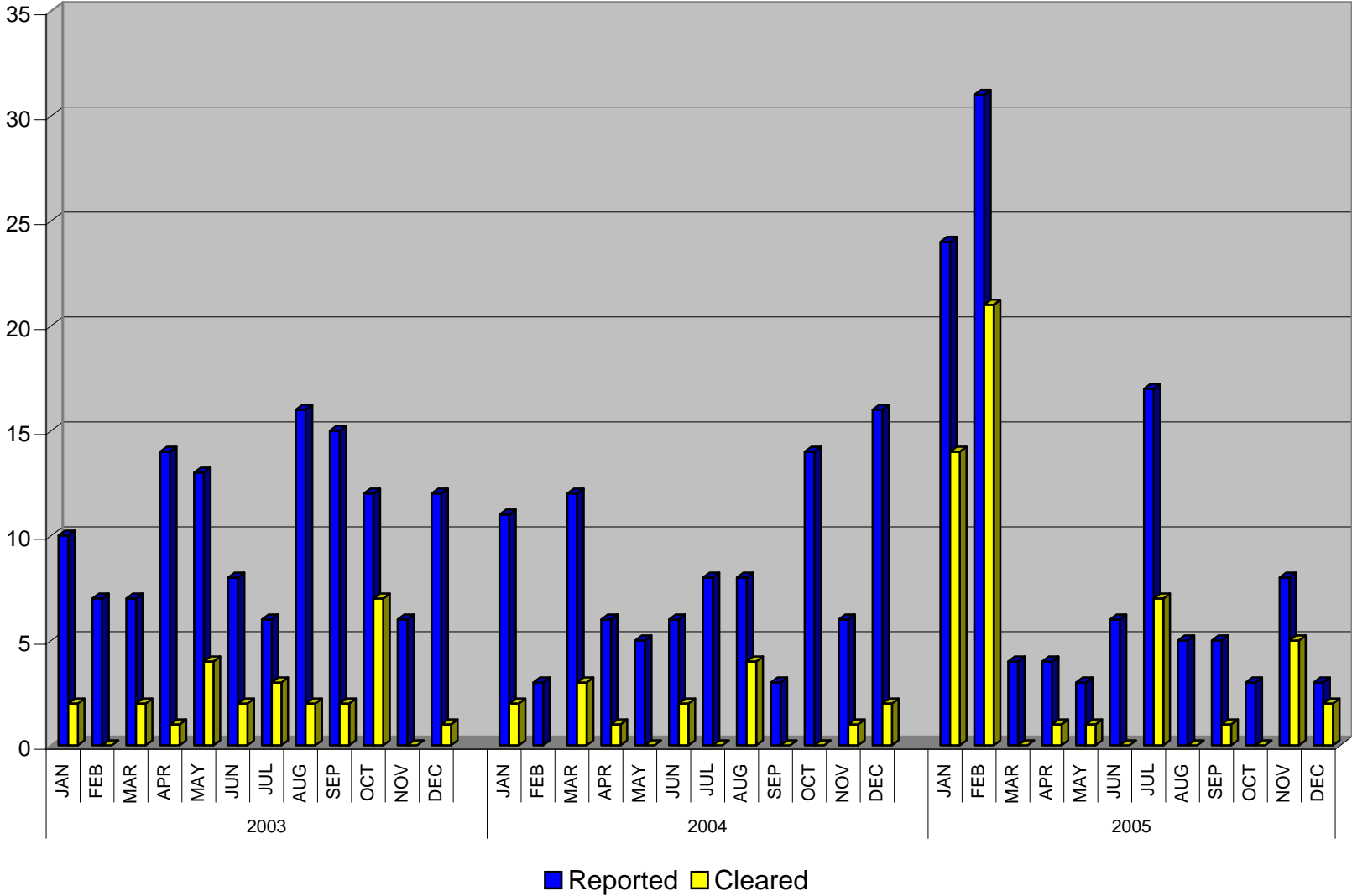
B & E Residence

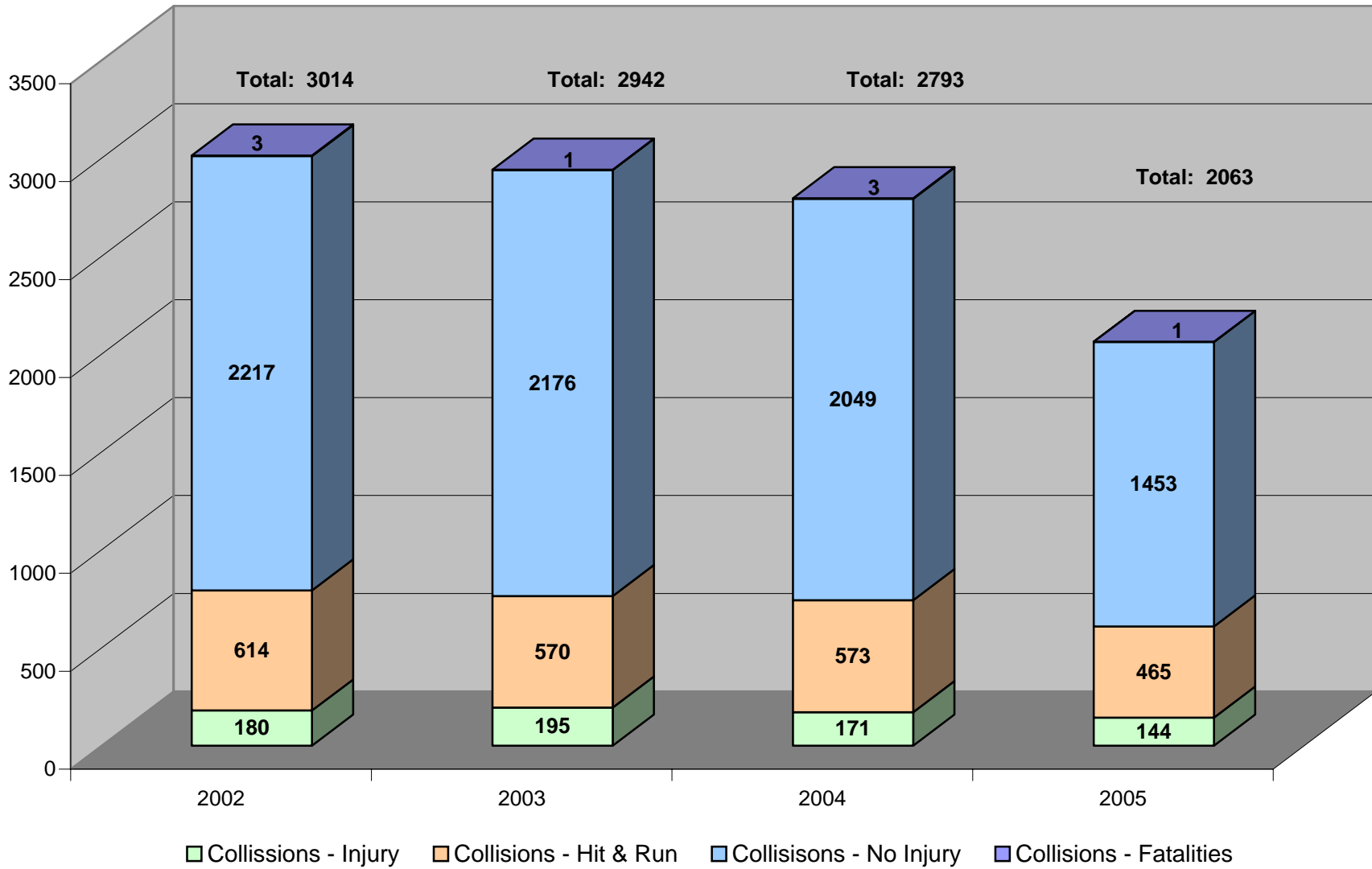
