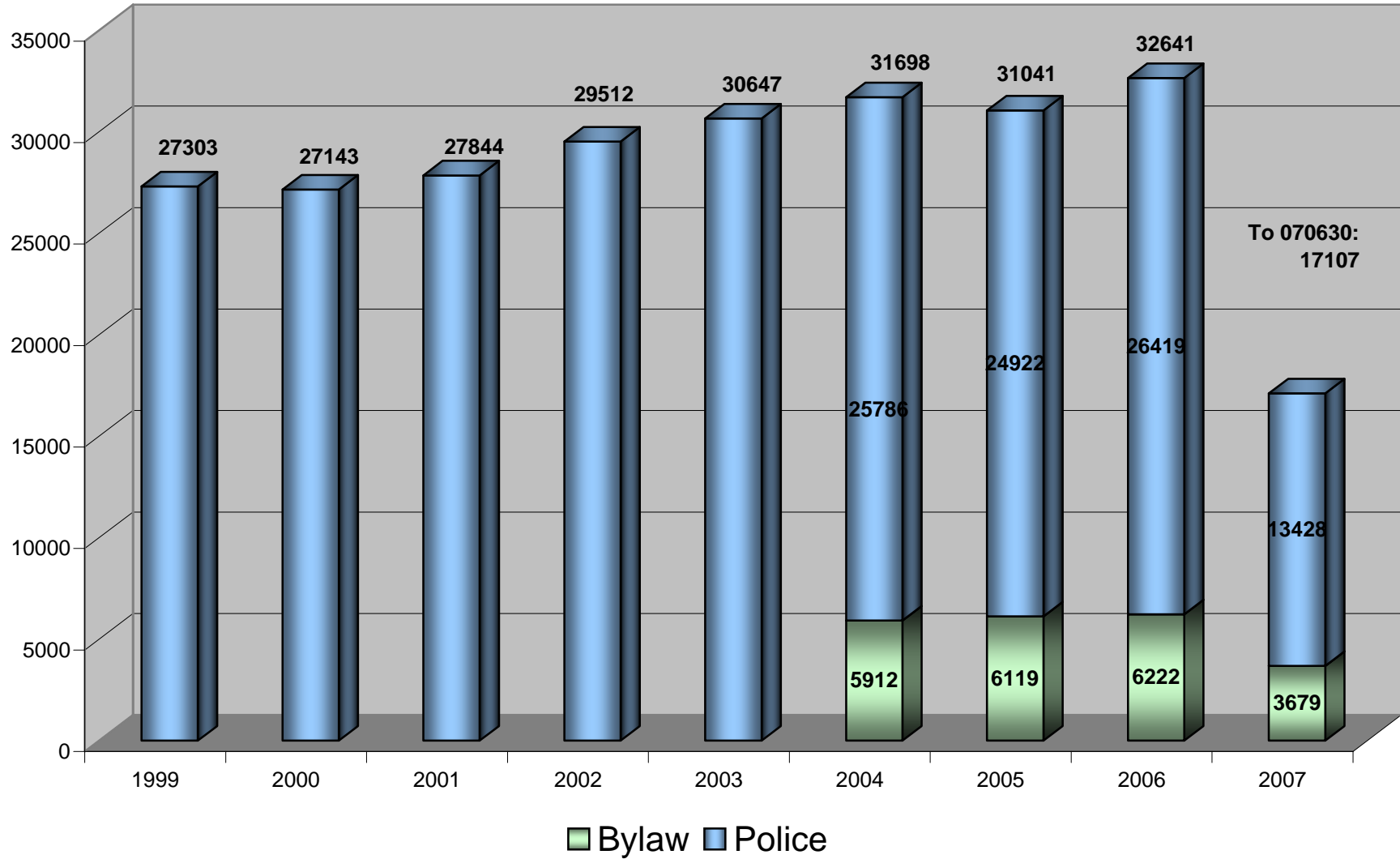

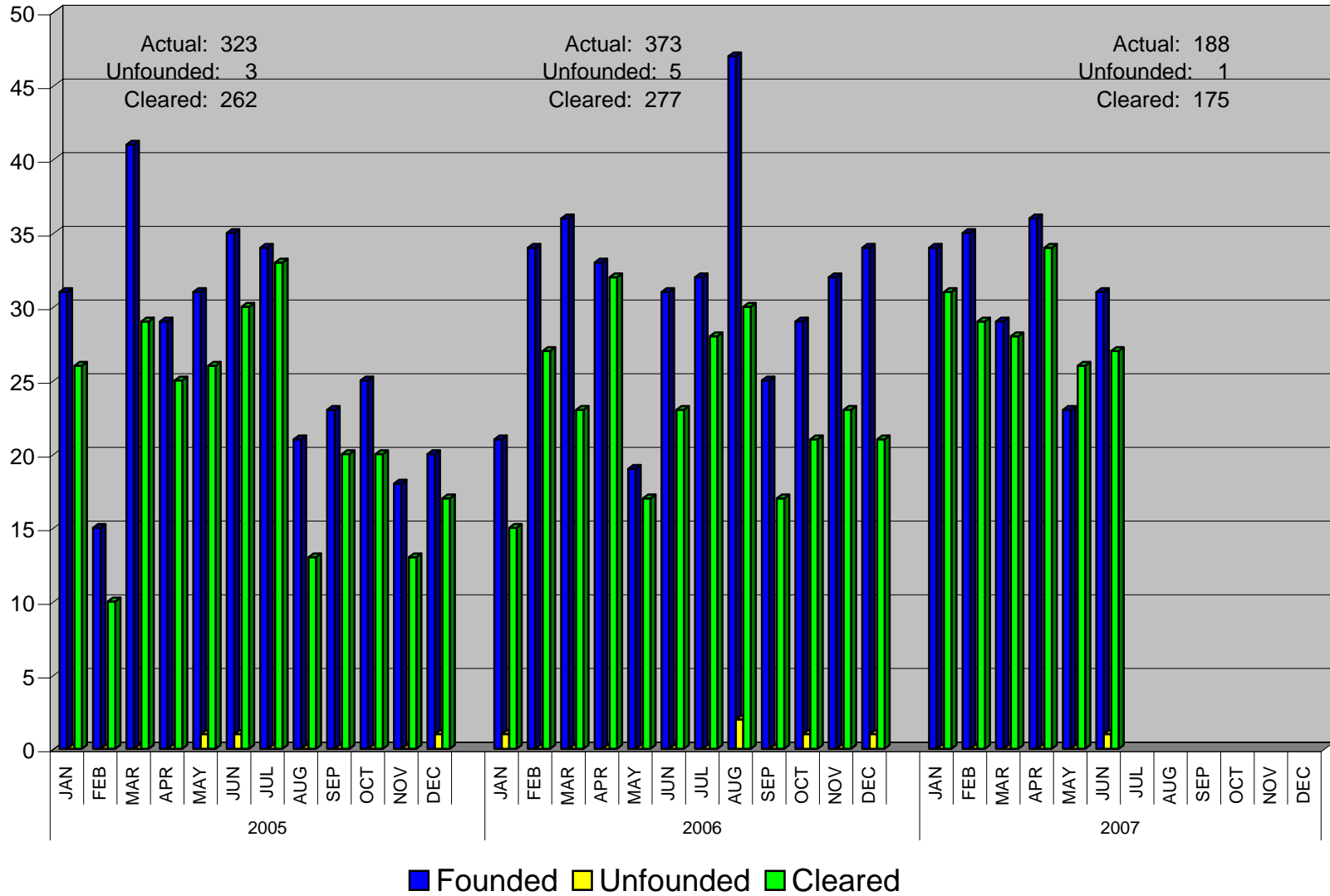

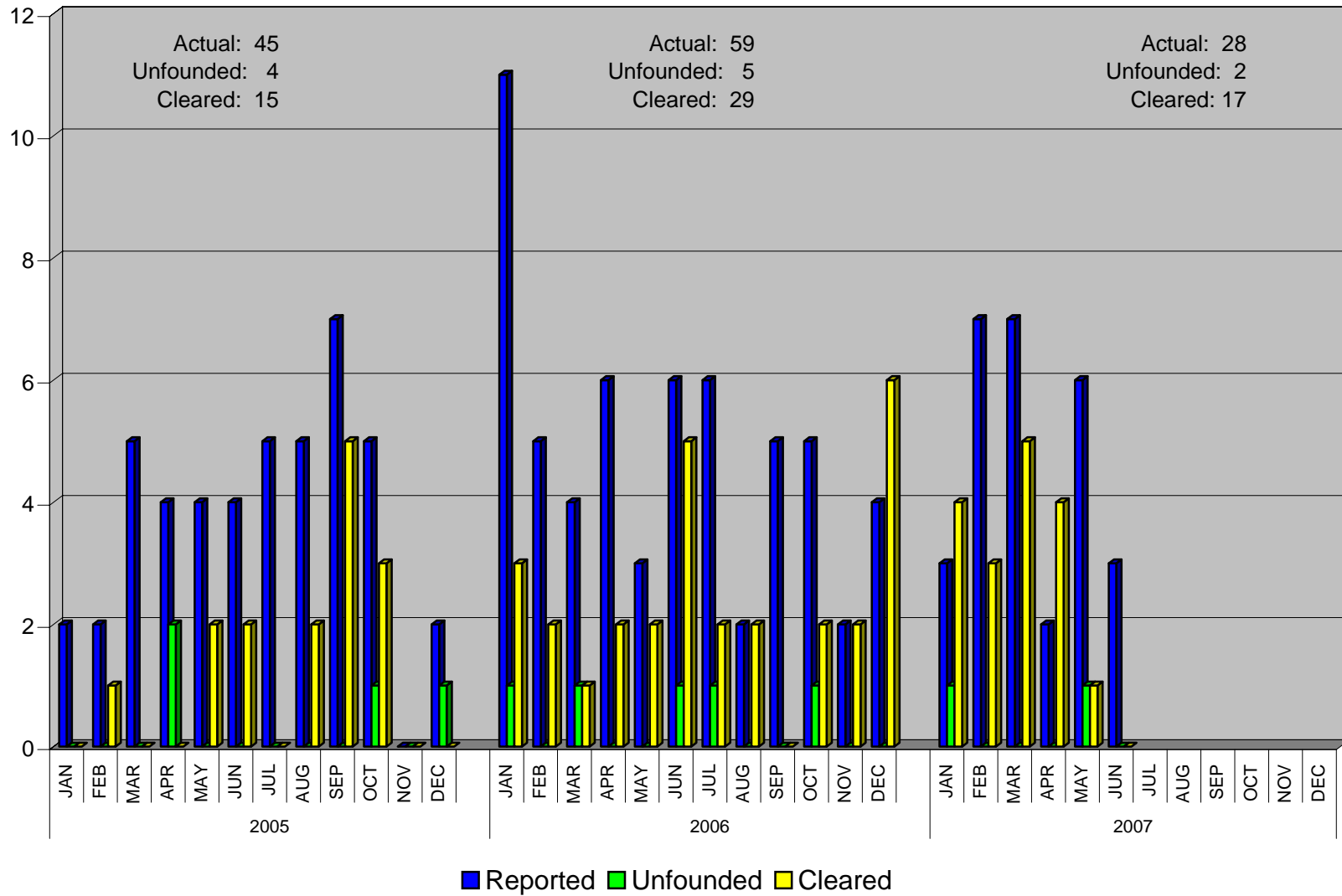
Assaults

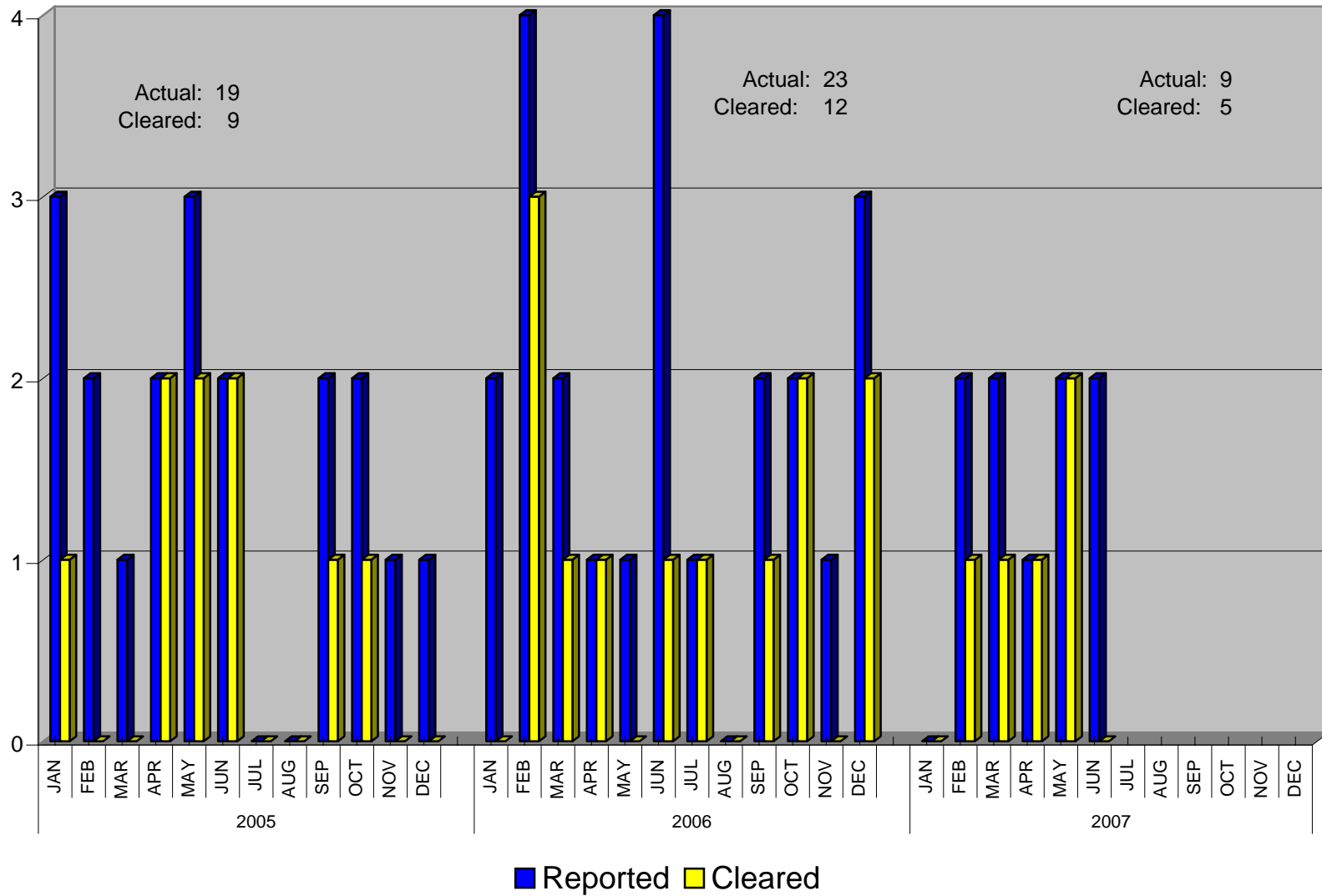
Sexual Assault

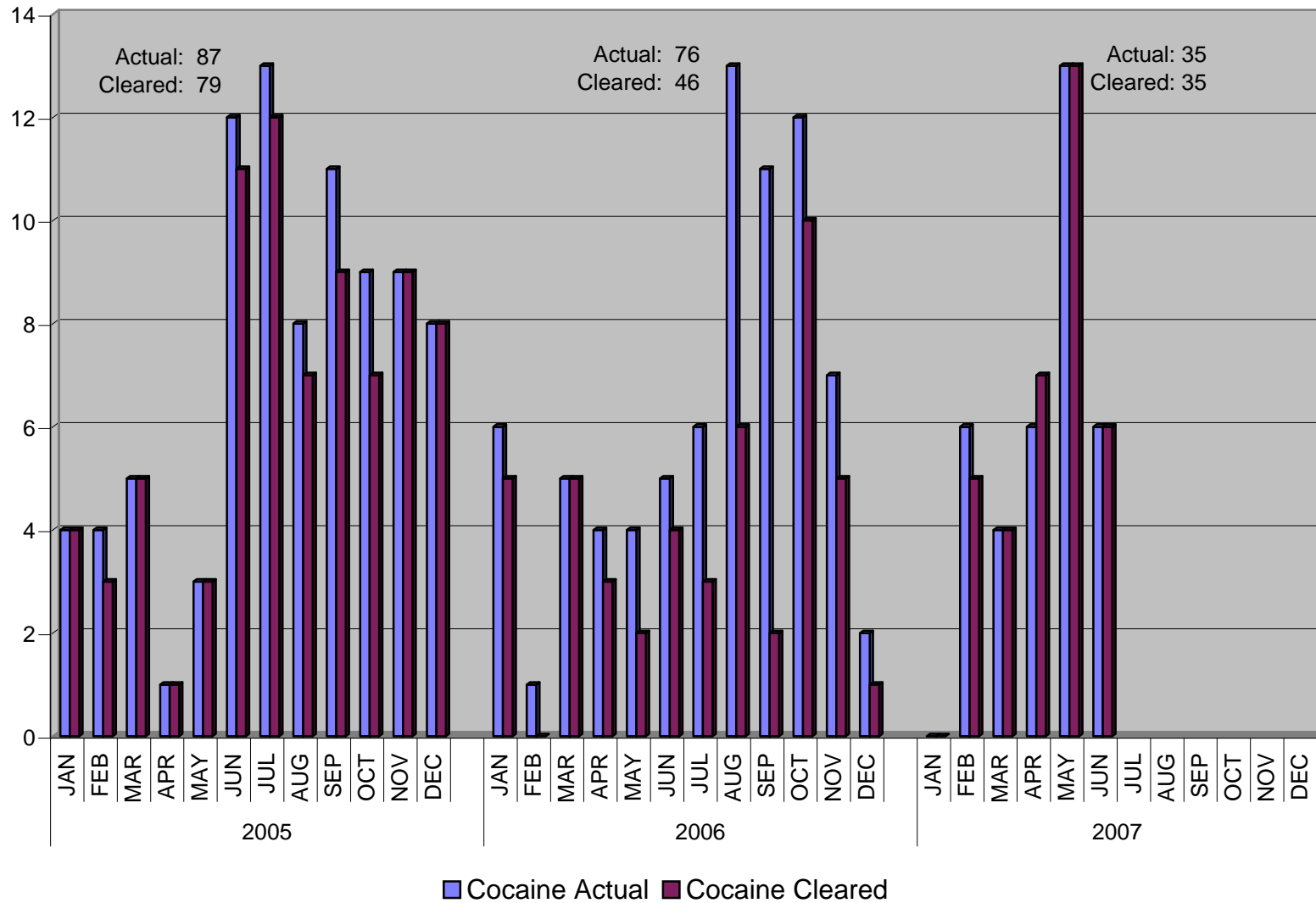


Robbery

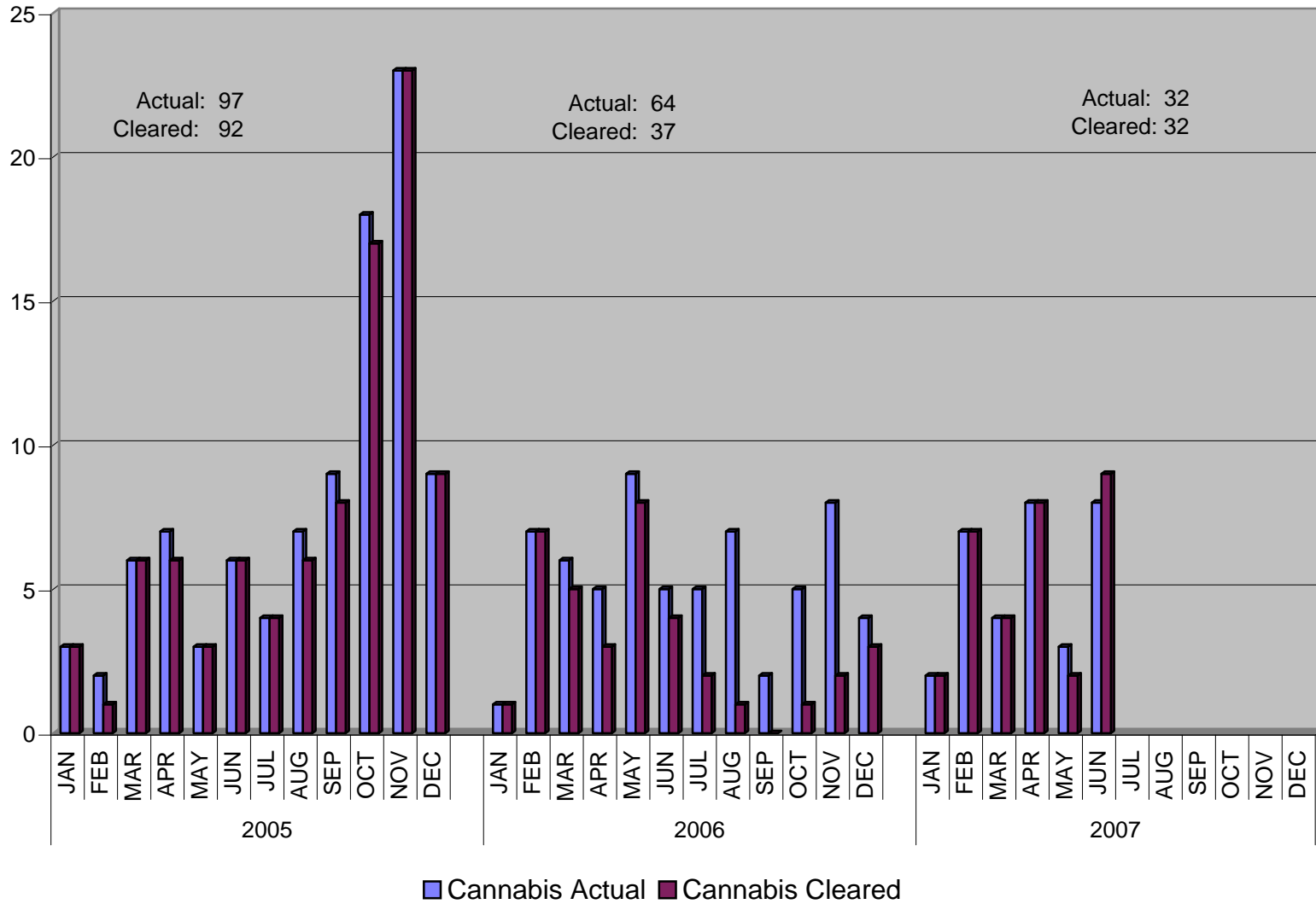

Narcotic Offences - Cocaine

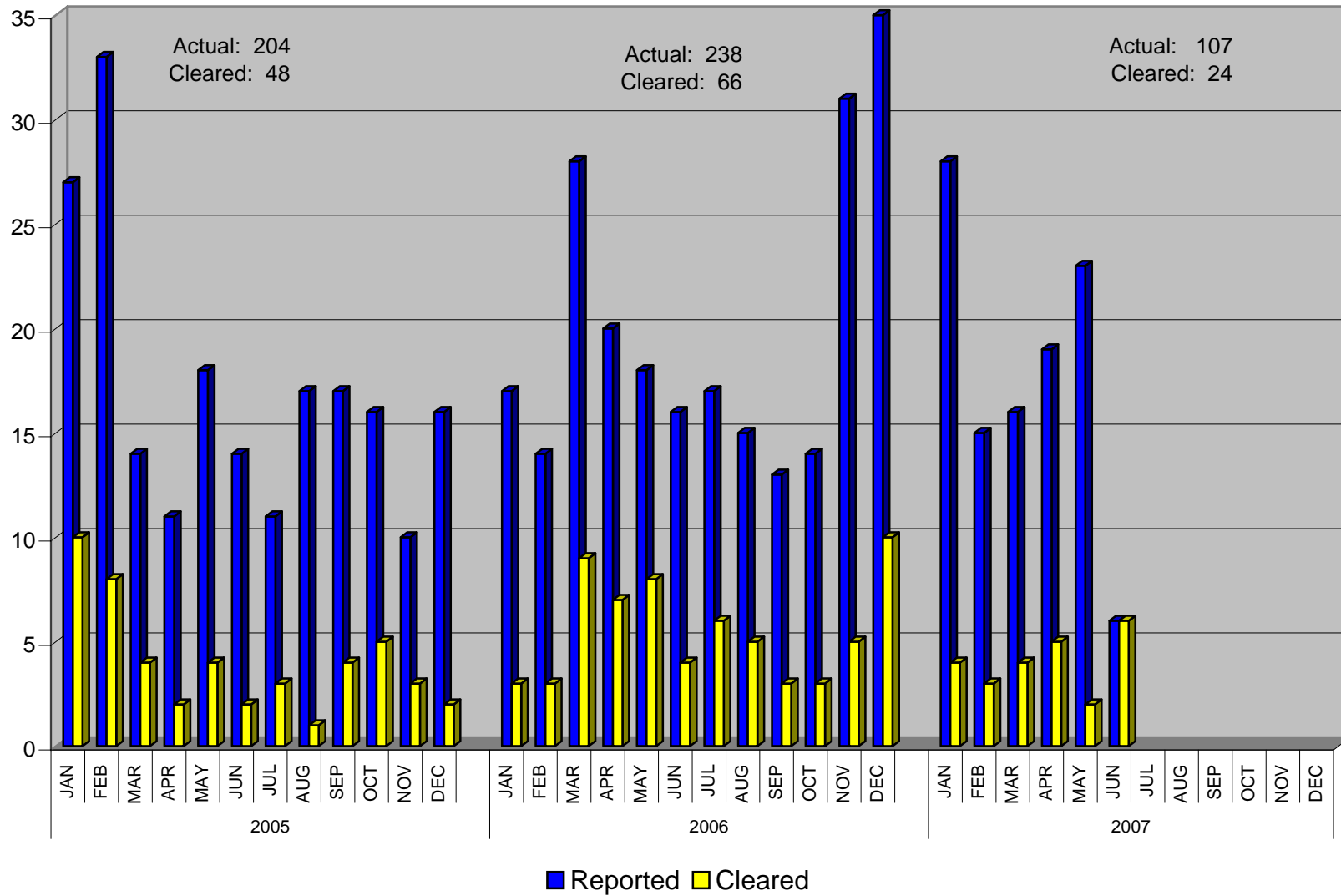


Narcotic Offences - Cannabis



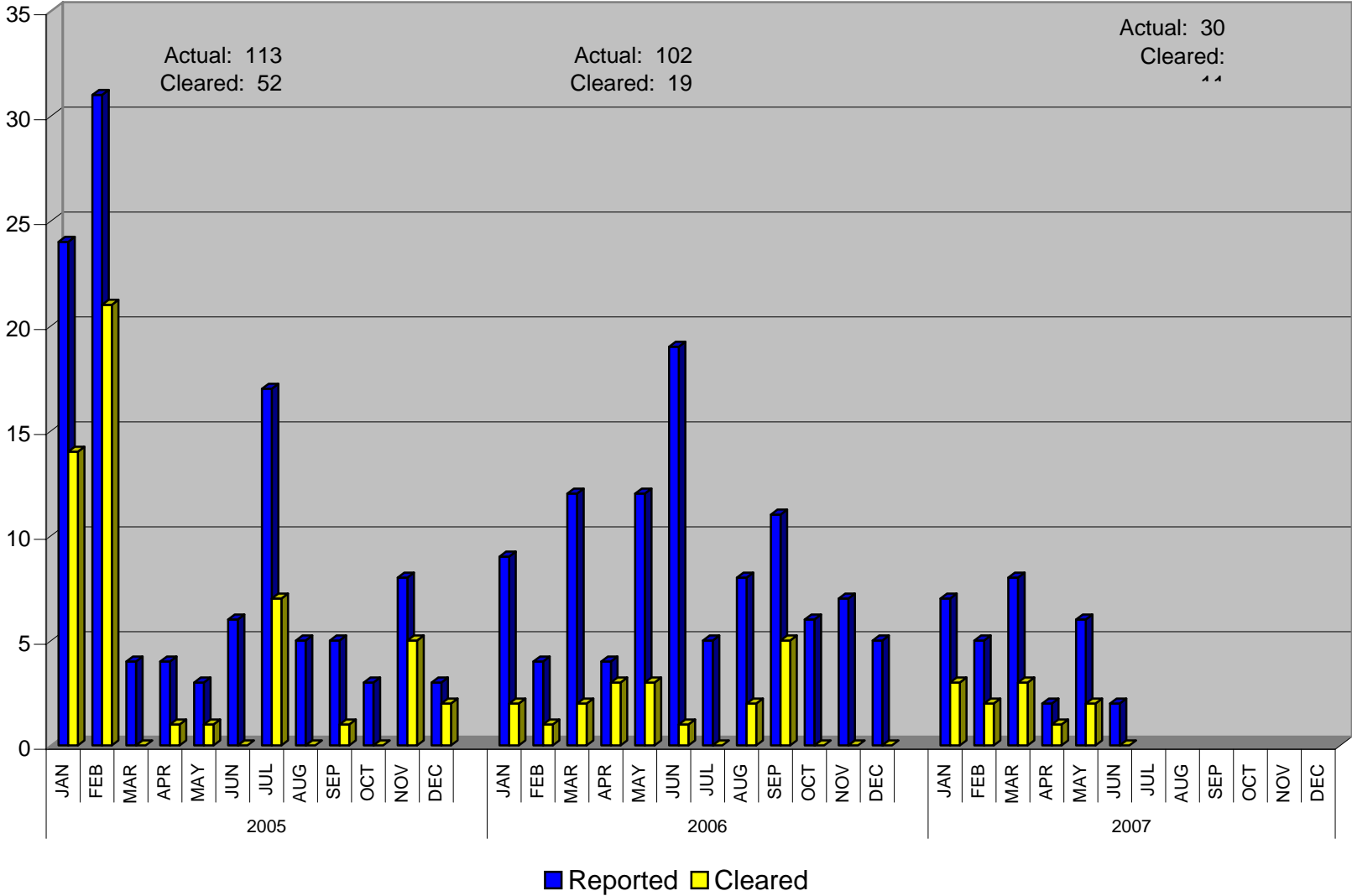

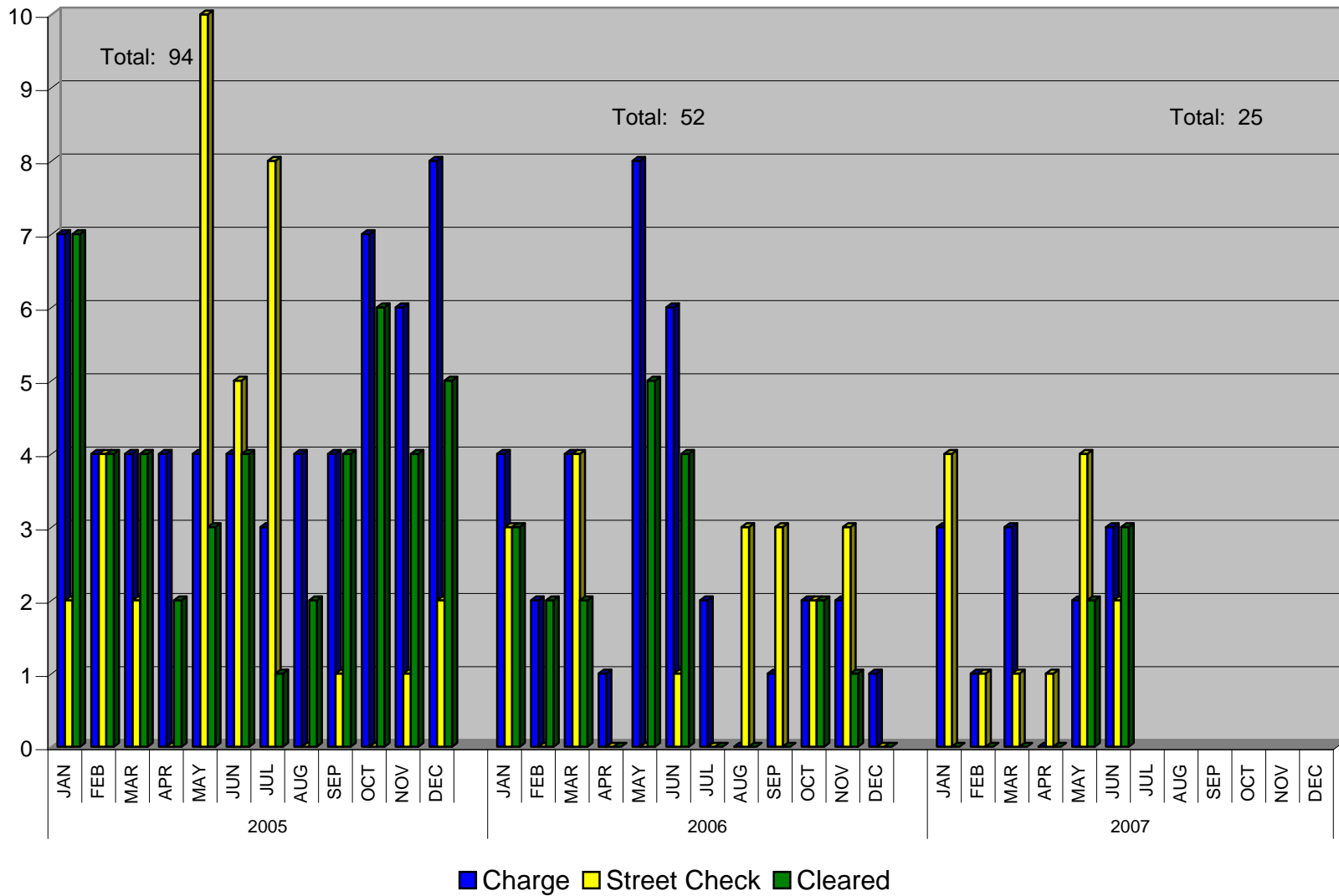

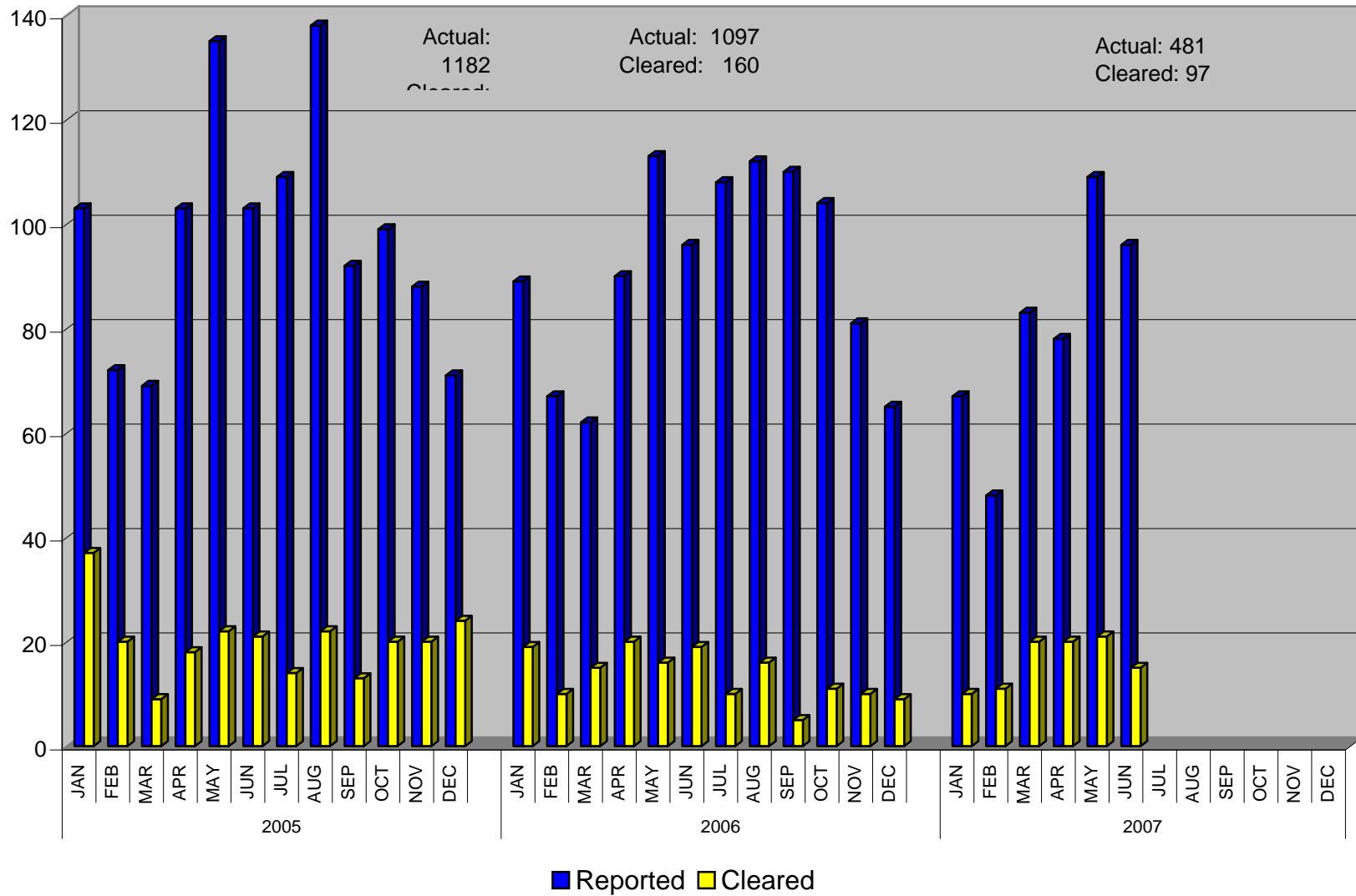

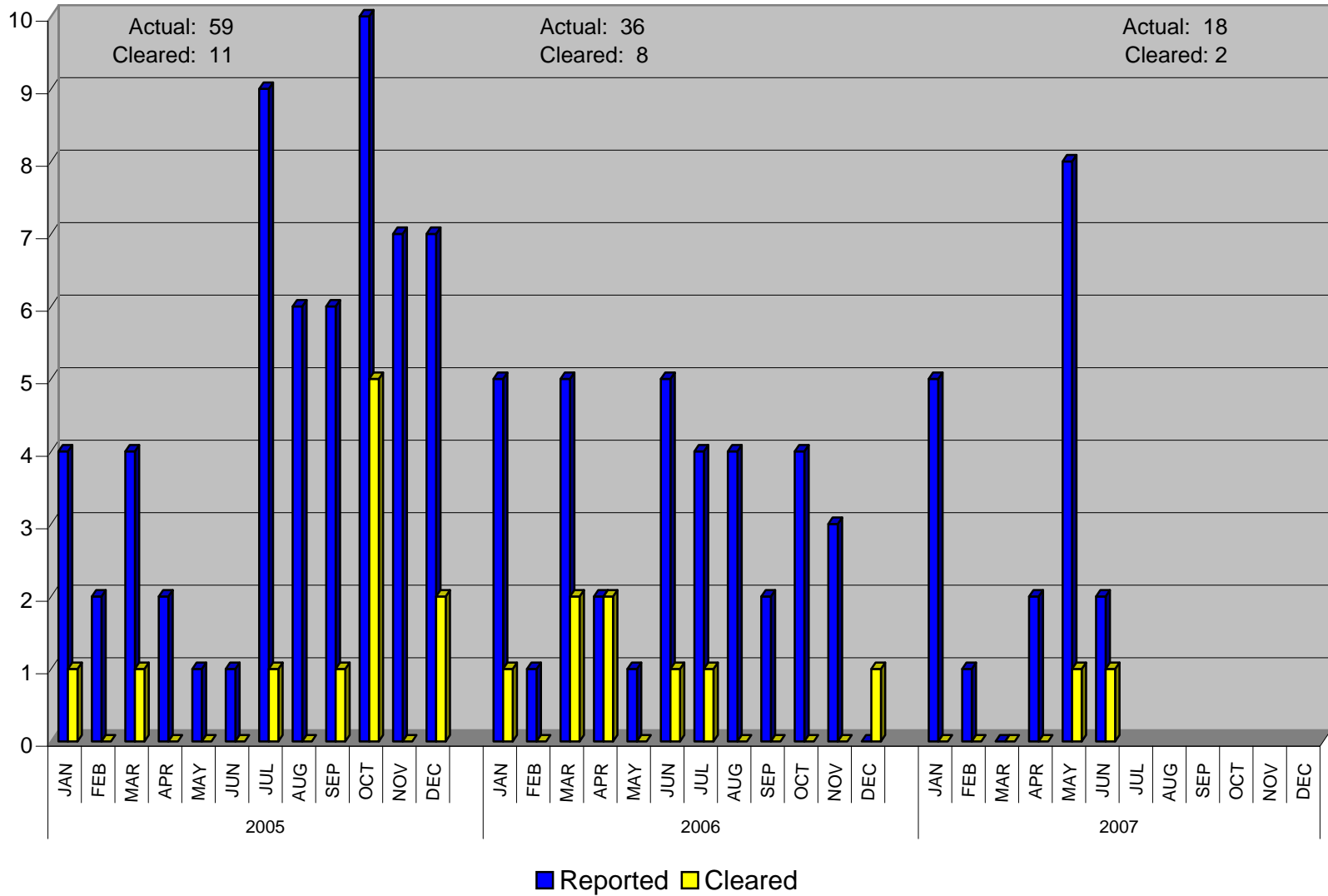
Theft Under

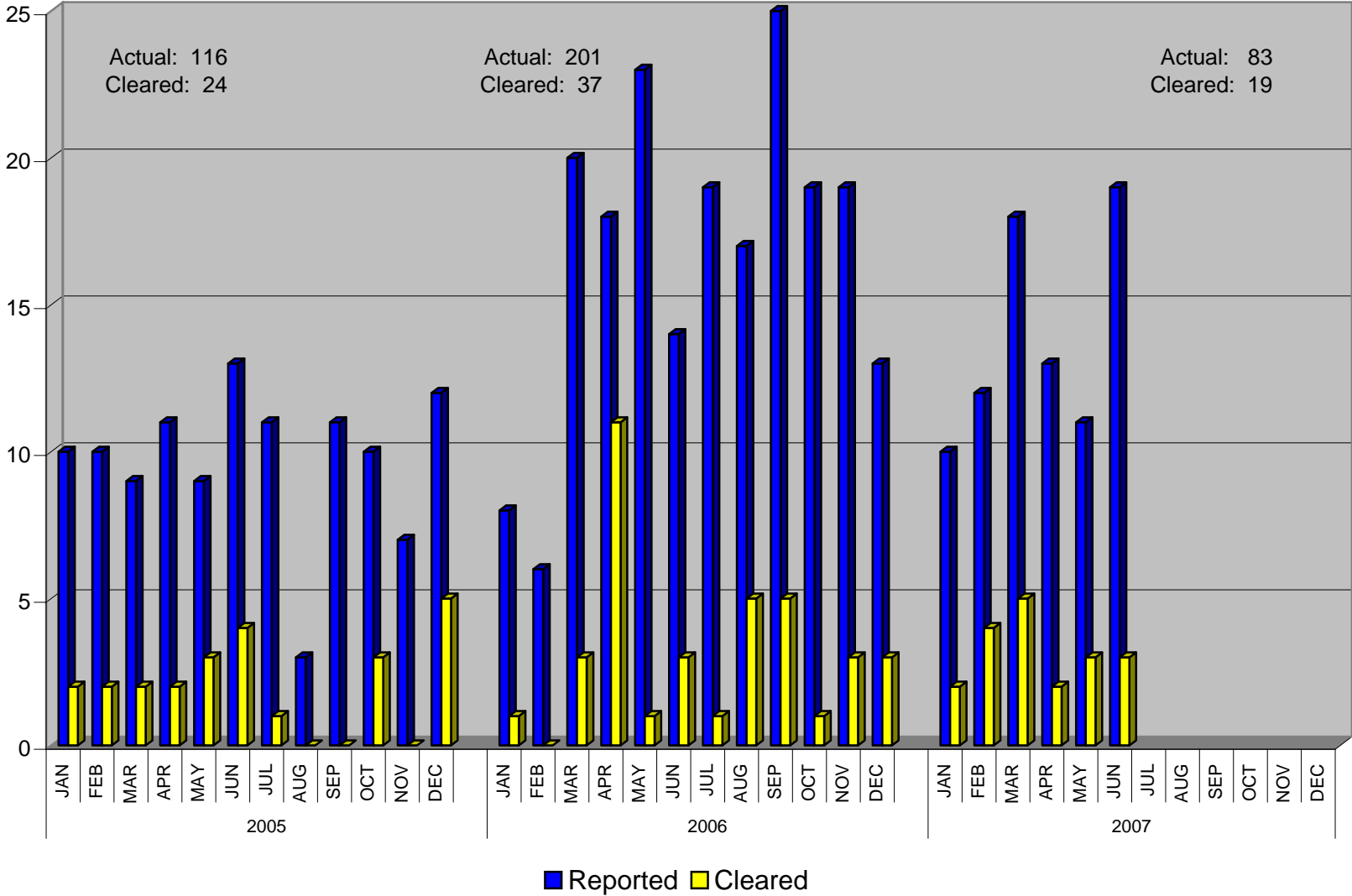
Theft Over

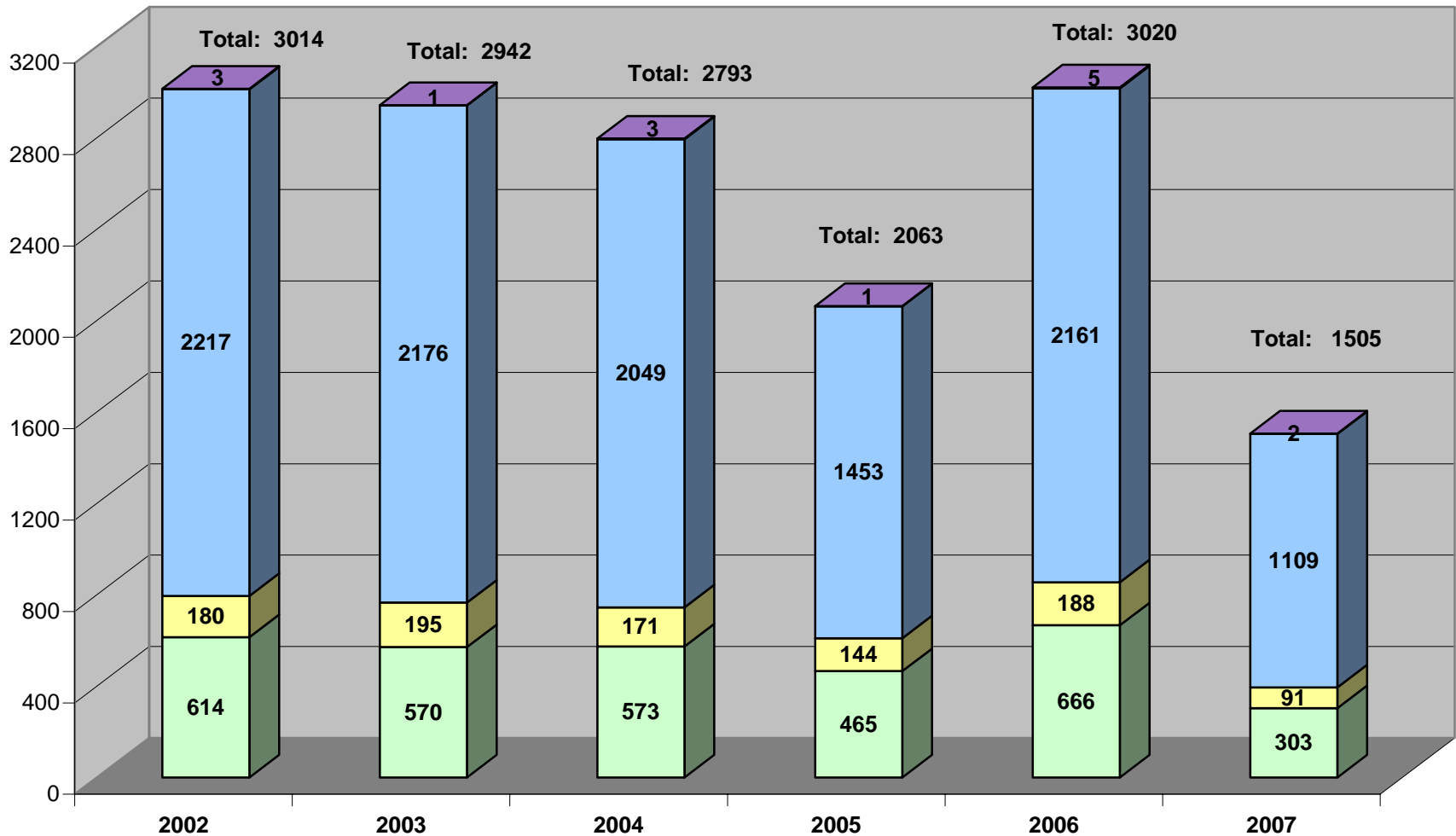


Theft Motor Vehicle

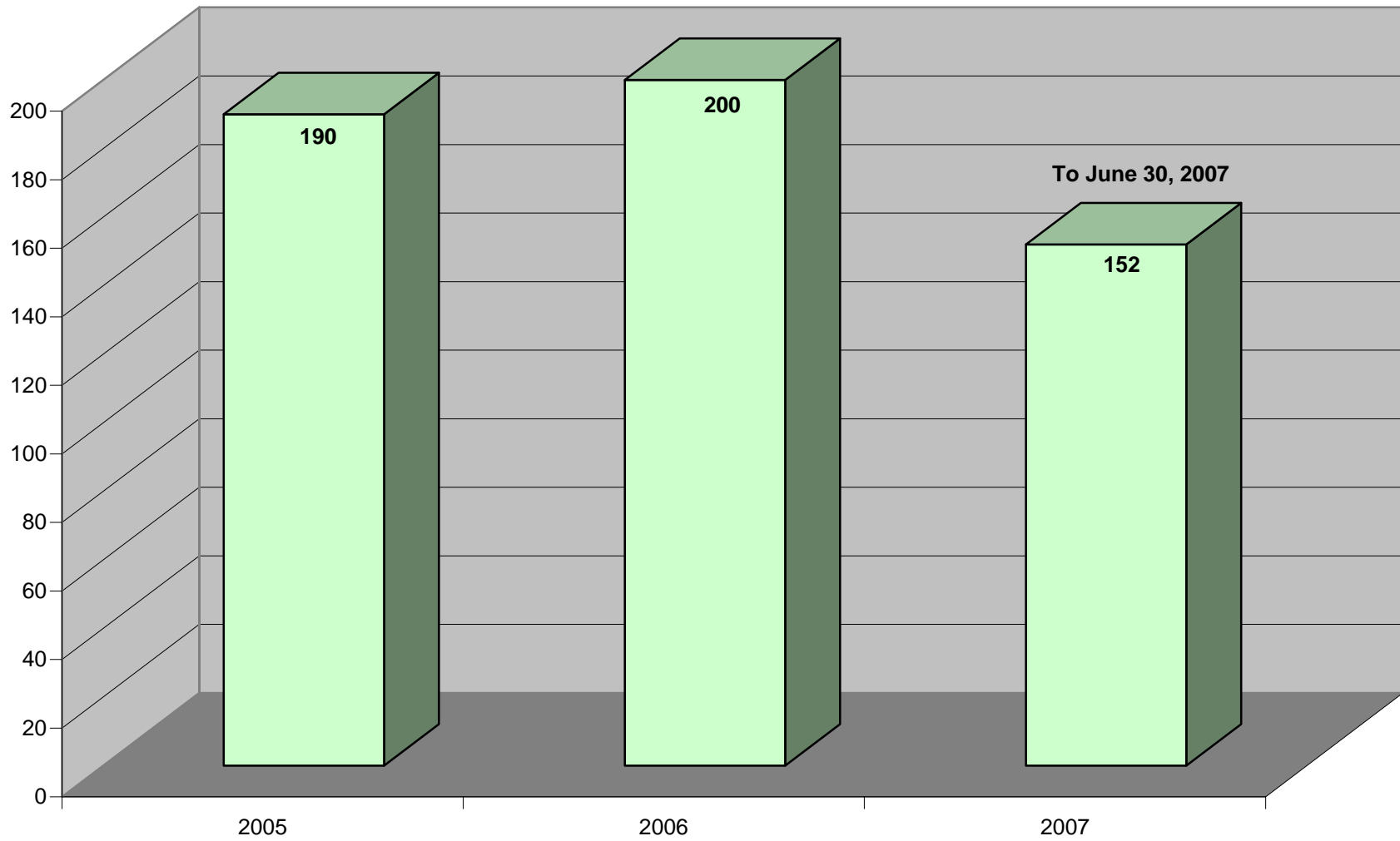


Traffic Accident Stats

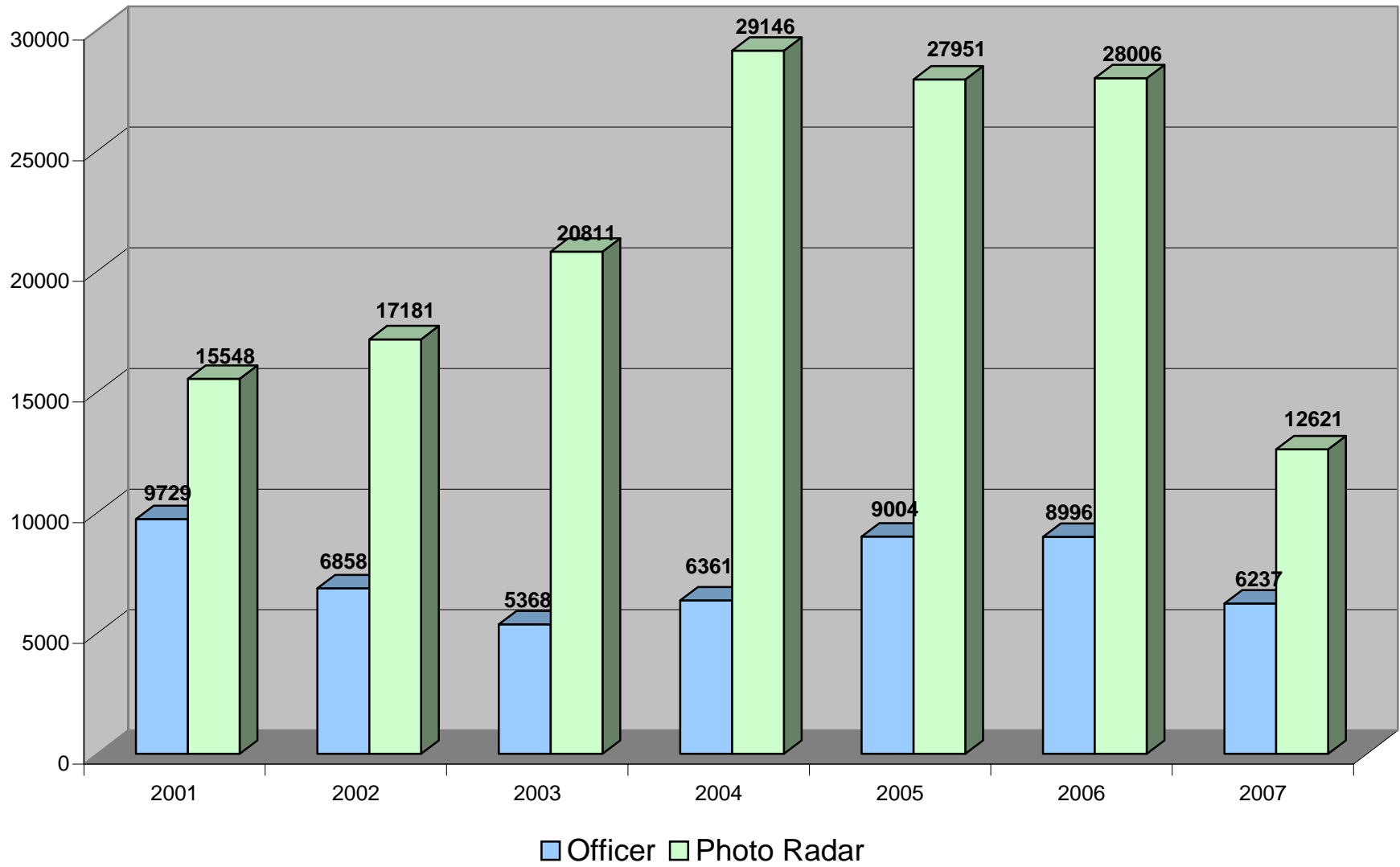

Impaired Driving Charges (Includes Exceed & Refuse)



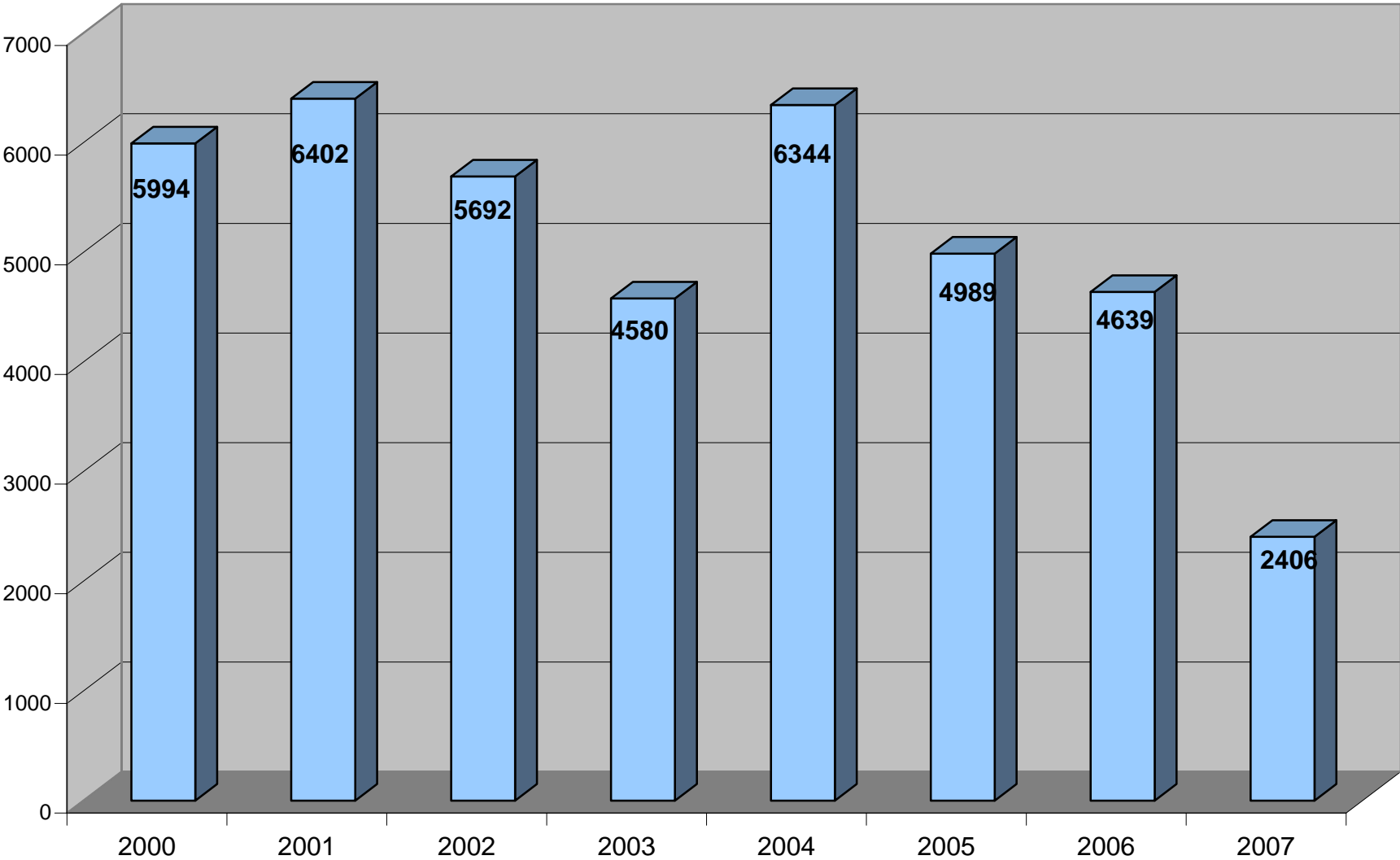

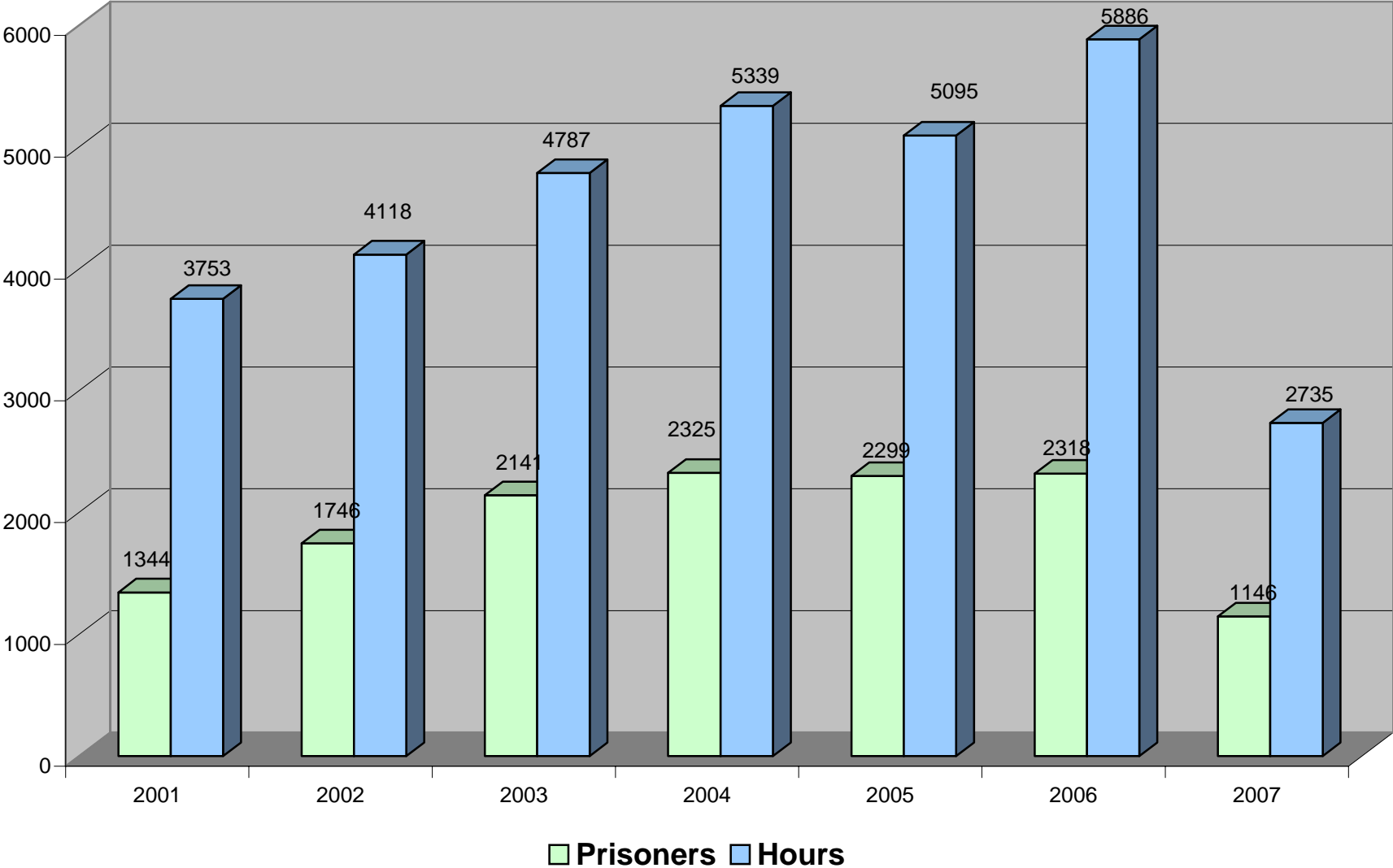

Mountain Bike Unit:

- The mountain bike unit initiated operation on May 12th, 2007. The unit consists of four constables that include Darlene Garrecht, Paul Taylor, Adam Gregory and Clarke White.
- The team established priorities for the season are as follows:
 - **Creating an atmosphere of safety in the downtown core by being visible in areas where loitering is most persistent.**
 - **Enforcement of GLA and CDSA offences in all areas, including Riverside Park and other identifiable areas where illegal alcohol consumption and drug use are present.**
 - **Visible patrol and enforcement of “crack houses” in and near the downtown core.**
 - Engagement with youth who are not complying with bicycle helmet laws and tobacco offences.
- The following stats are inclusive from May 12th to June 30, 2007. Listed below are the self generated work from MBU. They estimate they spend 70 – 80% in the downtown and surrounding area. They work from 11:00am to 2:00am daily.
 - Arrests - 83

 - Traffic safety Act Offences - 68
 - Warrants Executed - 64
