Following today's confidential meeting the following was brought forward as a rise and report item: The Commission approved the appointment of Andy McGrogan as Chief, pending ratification by City Council.

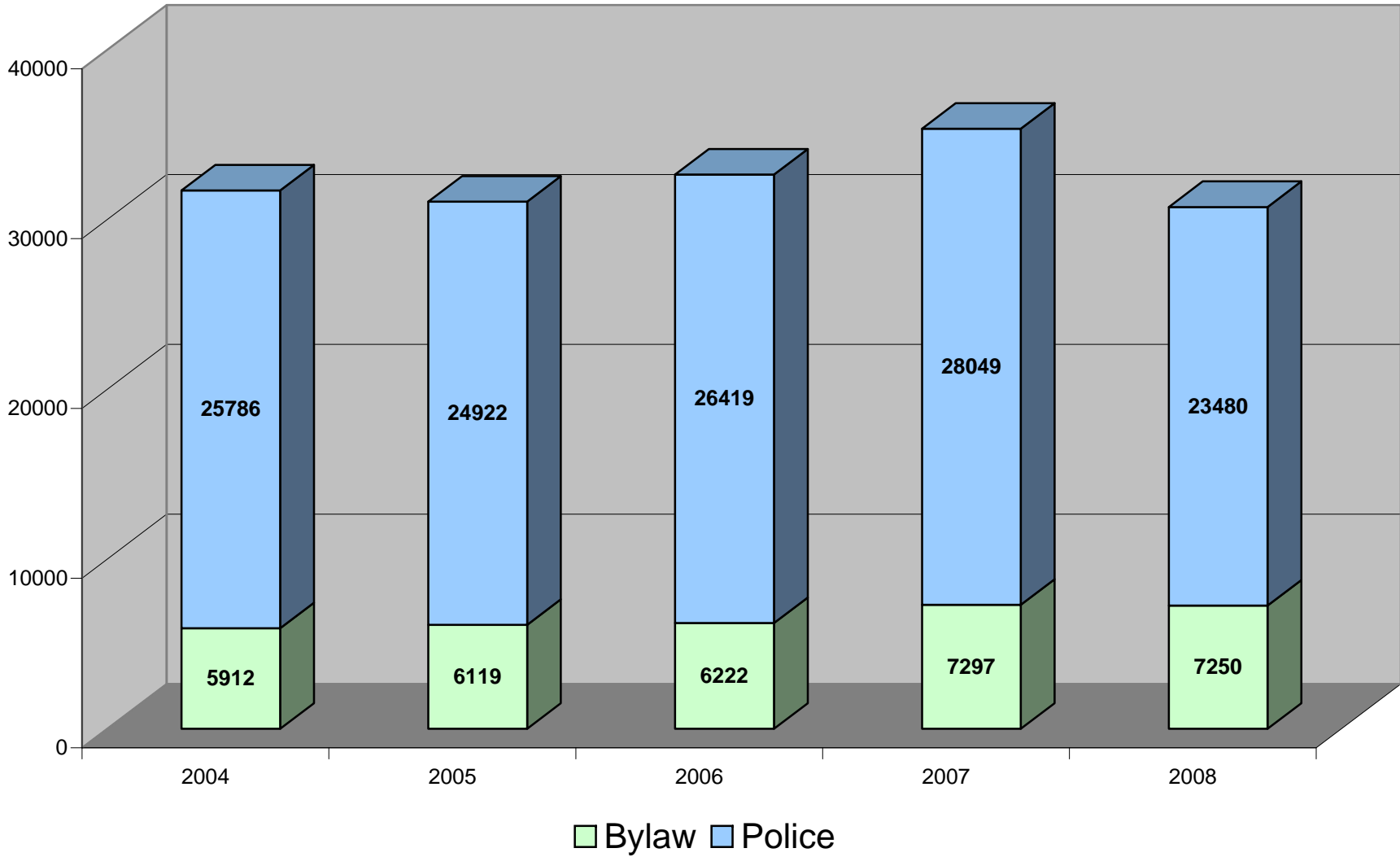

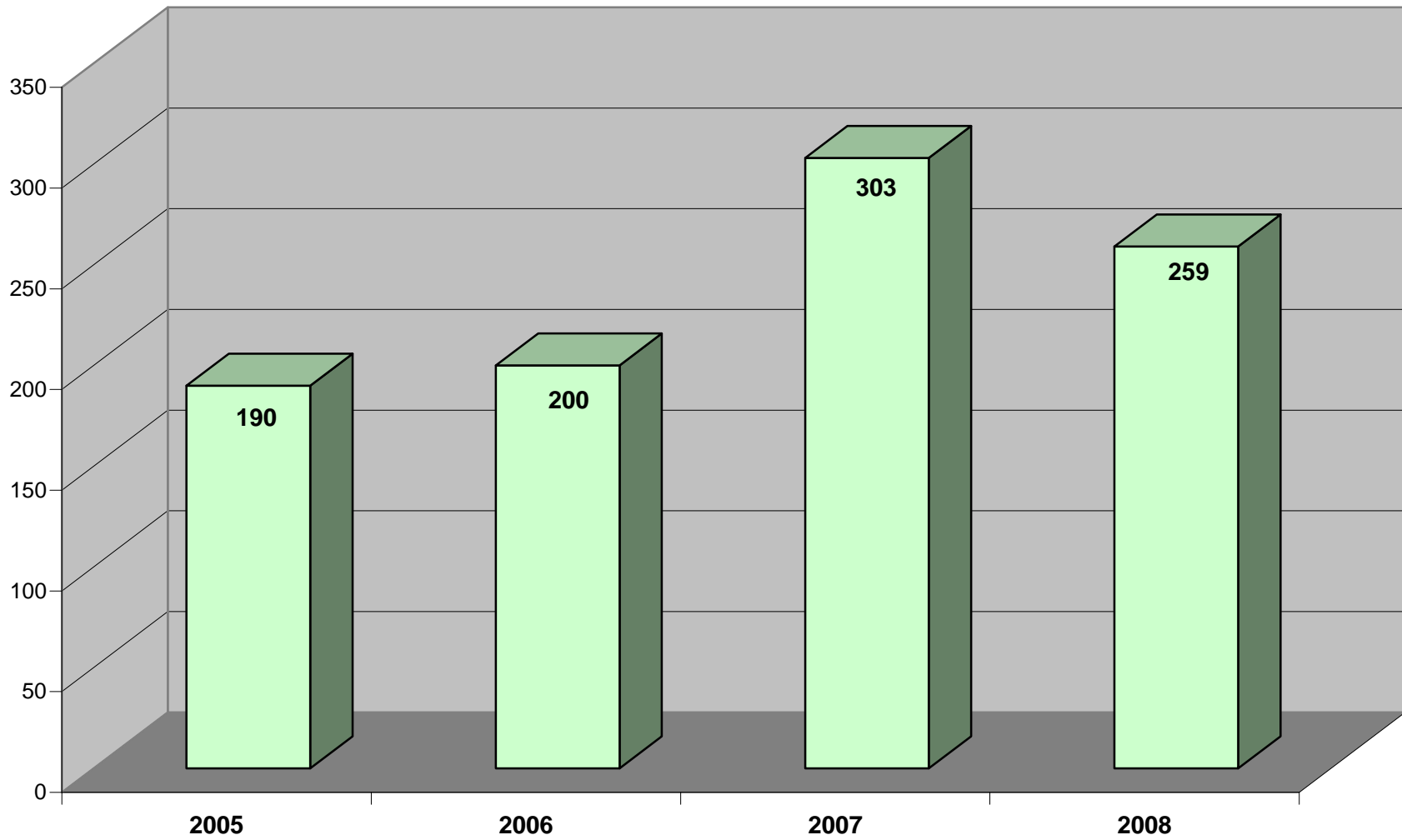

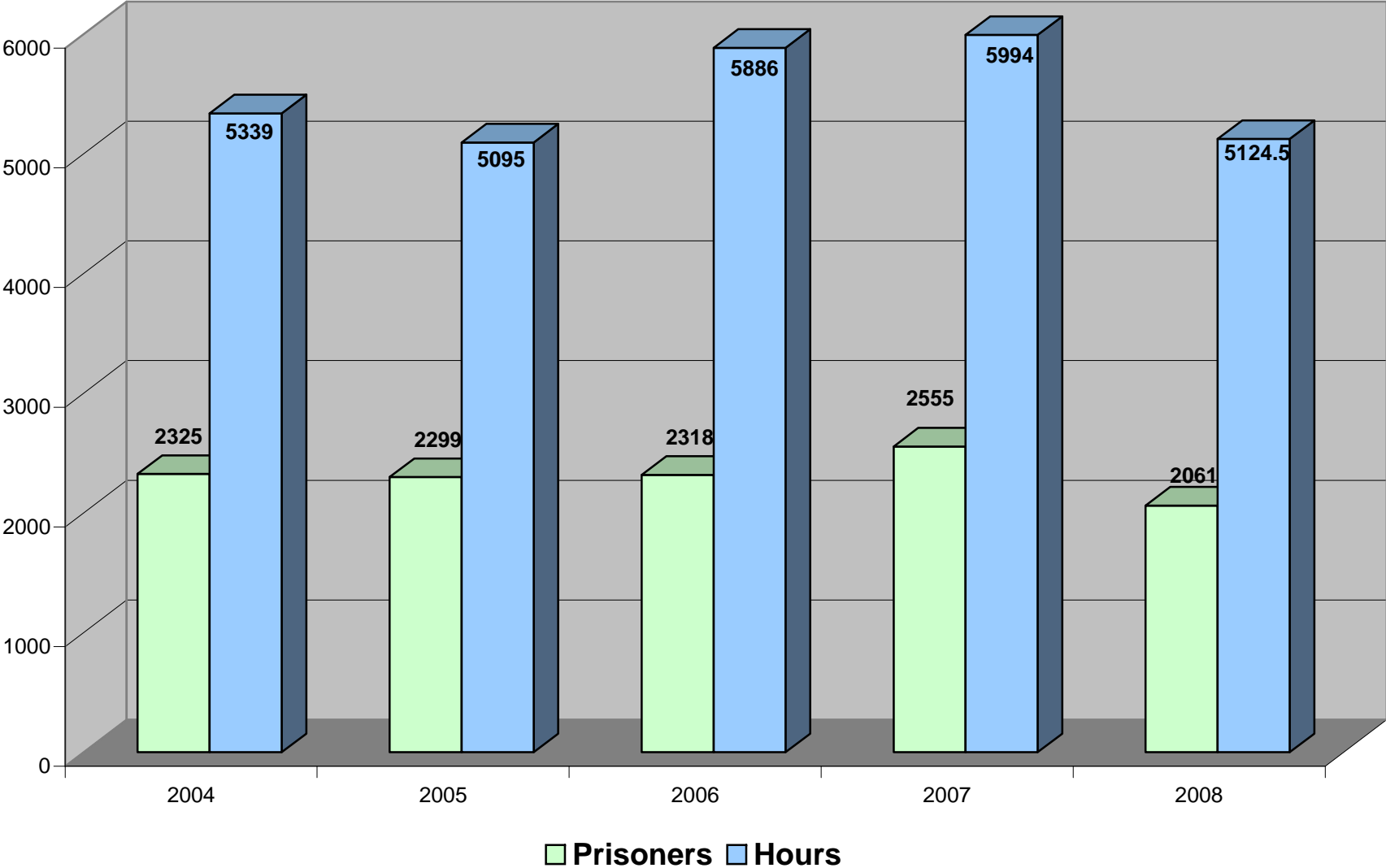
Contracted Parking Enforcement Stats



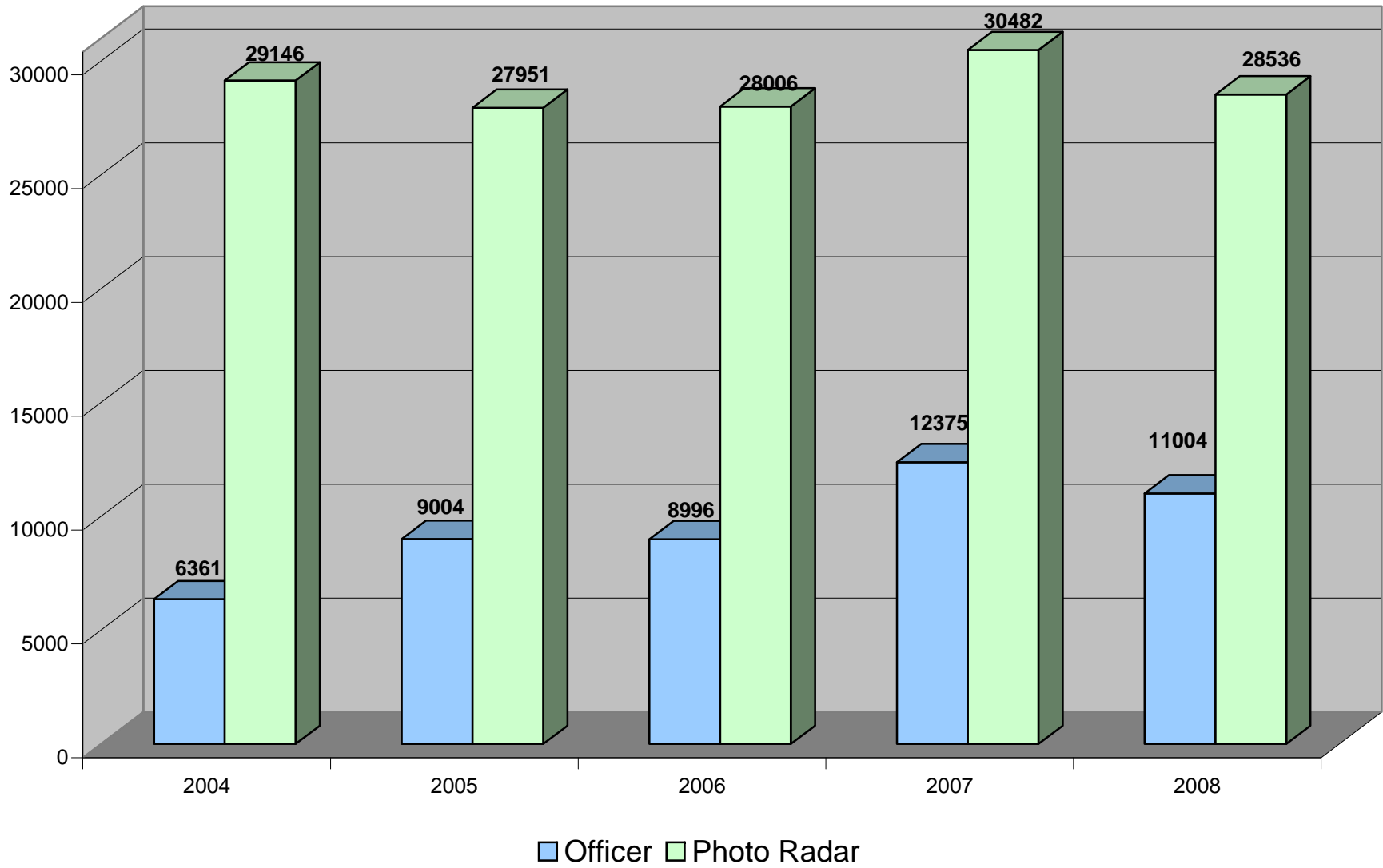
Impaired Driving Charges (Includes Exceed & Refuse)



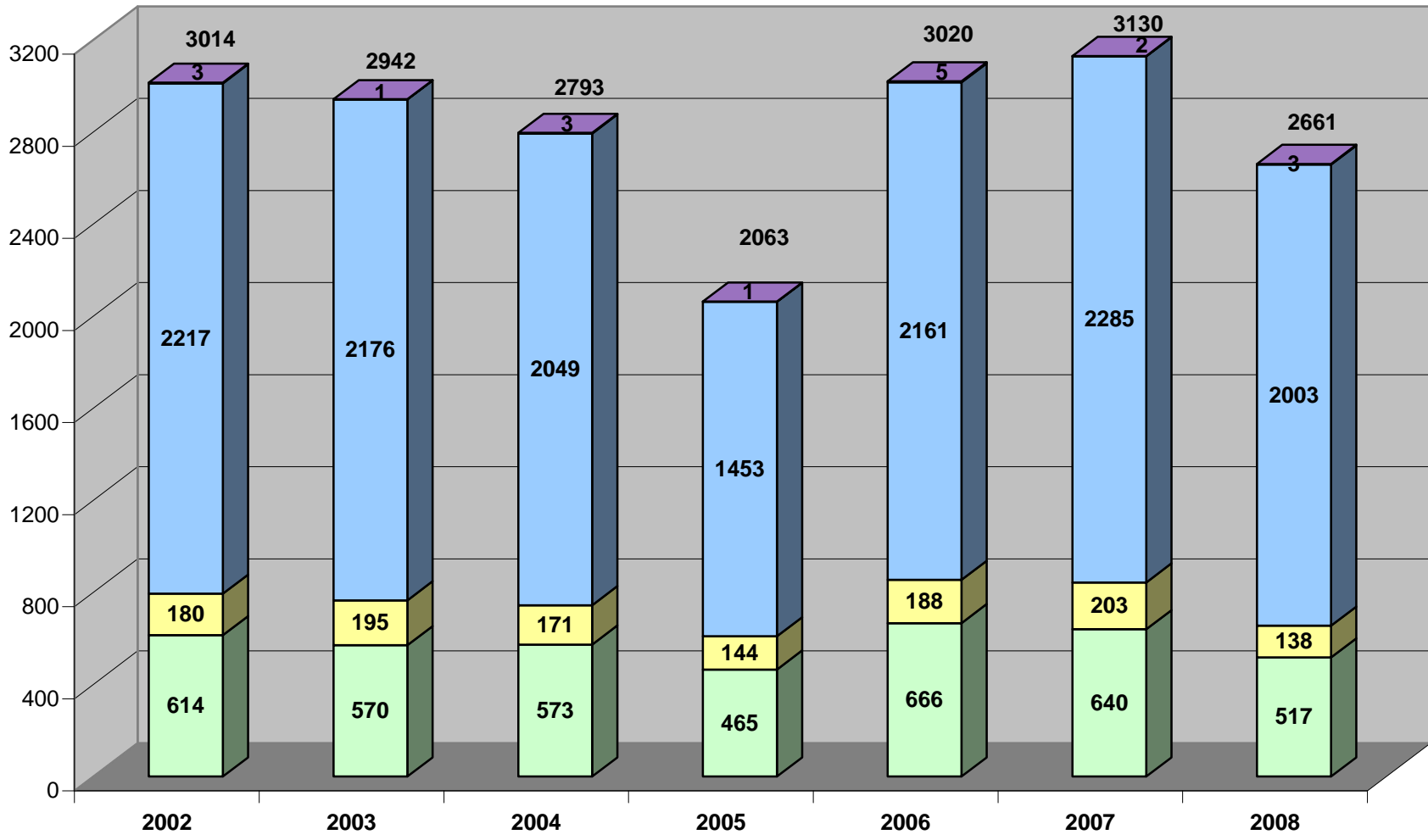
Prisoner Security Hours
